

Bark Sea Fox Cruising for Whales.
Monday Feb 8th 1864. Comes in with fine weather
and moderate breeze from the S.E. the Bark on
different tacks. Middle and latter part
quite a fresh gale from the S.E. Saw the
land.

Tuesday Feb 9th Comes in with fine weather
and moderate gale from the S.E. the Bark on
different tacks. Middle and latter part laying
too under close reef topsails. Saw nothing of
importance. Lat 35.12.1 Long 115.34 E

Wednesday Feb 10th Comes in with a
fresh gale from S.E. the Bark lying too under
close reefed Main topsail Middle part about
the same. Ends with heavy weather. The mate
has gone to duty again, after promising to do
better for the future.

Thursday Feb 11th Comes in with moder-
ate gale from S.E. the Bark under short sail.
Middle part about the same. Ends with
fine weather. Saw nothing of importance.
Lat 35.15.1 Long 115.37 E

Friday Feb. 12th Comes in with fine
weather and moderate breeze from the
S.E. the Bark heading by the wind to the
E.N.E. Middle part nearly calm. latter
part fresh breeze from S.E. passed Cape
Scurwin about 4 P.M. Steering to the N.W.
Lat 34.30 S Long 115.00 E

Saturday Feb. 13th This day fresh
breeze and squally steering to the
N.E. passed Cape Naturatus about 3 P.M.
and Anchored at Wasse about 10 P.M.
