Friday June 24th
 Fine weather and good breeze at 130 P.M. raised sperm whales a large school lowered down immediately and succeeded in taking three one to each of three Larborel boats. Mid part took the third whale along side at about 3 P.M. Sat part at day light collected all hands and came cutting in more whales in sight this P.M. going quick

Saturday June 25th
 Strong breeze and rough weather it rather bad-cutting have taken in two of the whales & part of the third. Mid part very rough Sat part do with rain

Sunday June 26th
 Moderating finely still here cutting in June 30th since the 26th we have been boiling out & have had an amount of rough weather have seen sperm whales once, weather not favorable whales going to windward to day we are engaged slowing down.

July 1st *July 2^d*
 Gaming with *Barge Napoleon* *Barge Napoleon* fine weather

Sunday July 3rd
 Very pleasant weather One sail Finbacks & killers around Mid part under short sail Sat part One sail.

Monday July 4th
 Beautiful weather good breeze from Northward at 12.30 P.M. raised sperm whales lowered & chained them untill sunset when we returned to ship minus a fish Mid part under short sail Sat part thick haze weather and good breeze plenty Finbacks around

Tuesday July 5th
 Good breeze from the N.W. weather thick and haze engaged repairing the ship. Mid part under short sail Sat part with N.W. Commencing

Wednesday July 6th
 Good breeze from N.W. Solithward occasional light rain squalls the Barge Napoleon in sight. Mid part lying under short sail Sat part moderate breeze

Thursday July 7th
 Moderate breeze from S.W. Napoleon still in sight Mid part wind since E. very light Sat part wind N. buying saw Finbacks

Friday July 8th
 Very strong breeze from the Northward steering Eastward saw Finbacks at sunset Barge Napoleon ran down to us and Capt. Fuller came on board stepped one hour shortness sail for the night Mid part short sail Sat part strong breeze from S.W.

Saturday July 9th
 Moderate gale from S.W. One sail in sight Mid part under short sail Sat part light breeze spoke Barge Napoleon of New Bedford

Sunday July 10th
 Napoleon 25 miles out 11.00 lbs. First part light breeze from S.W. gaming with Napoleon saw Porpoises. Boast pork for dinner preserved peaches for supper Mid part calm and light airs. Sat part one sail also a sulphur bottom whale in sight

Monday July 11th
 Good breeze from the S.W. Three sails at 6 P.M. gaming Barge Albion & Milton 12.50 Mid part finished gaming Sat part at 7.30 P.M. raised sperm whales lowered down in company with Milton & Albion Boats so much chasing whales

Tuesday July 12th
 Good breeze from light breeze fine weather still in pursuit continued the chase untill darkness compelled us to give up. took one small whale The Milton and Albion also took one I saw saw so many whales before but they were very hard to catch Mid part took the whale along side which counts me whale number 4 ship carrying aboard Sat part at 6 A.M. called all hands and cutting West piece came in at 7.30 against light breeze
