

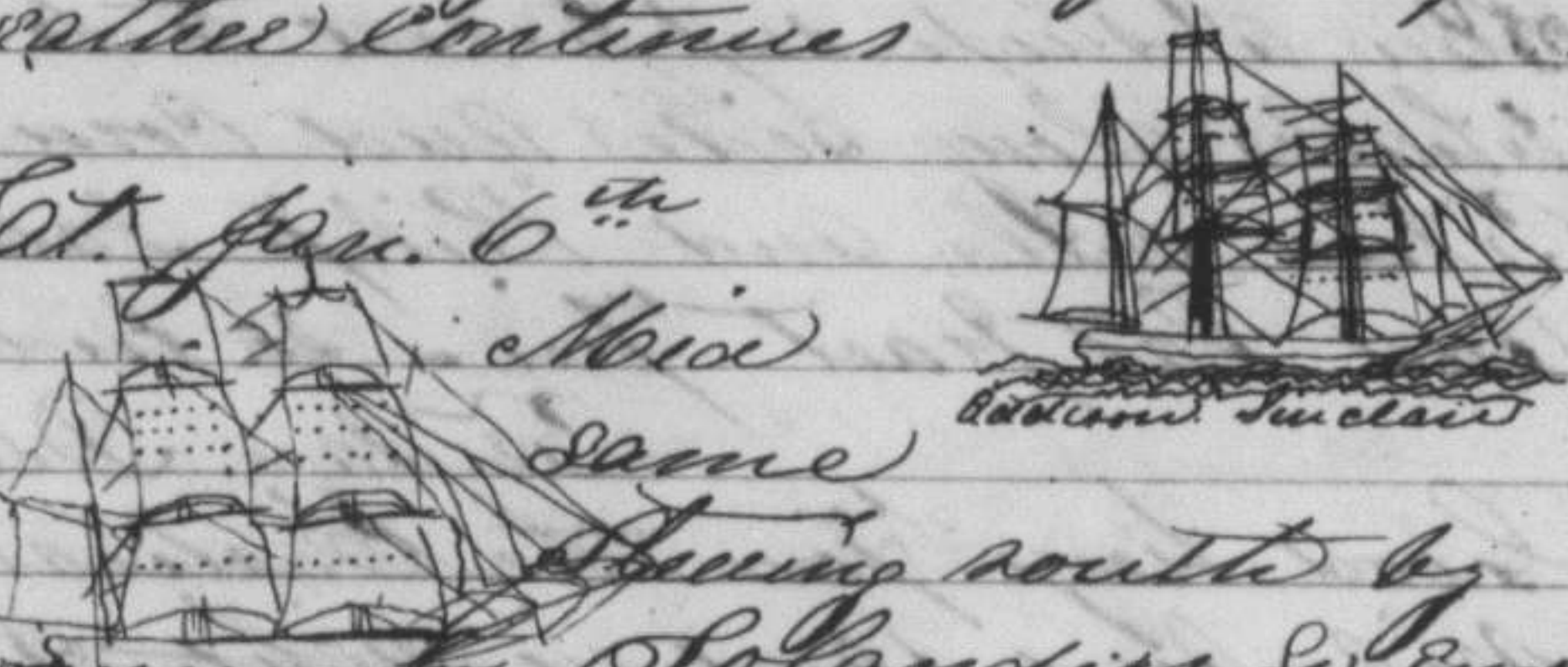
Round to the Solanders

Sun Jan 14th

Weather Fine. Wind moderate from the Westward.

breez. Packed inside the Solander rocks. Meia and
Lat part fine so end.

Tues. Jan. 16th

Sight air and calms. Revising inside the rocks
Woke and sat part the same scene.

Wee Jan. 17th

Good breeze from W. S. W. considerable rain
steering off shore. Wind part wind from East
hauling to North and N. W. squally and blowing
on at about 6 Am. have to headed to W. S. W.
but part blowing a heavy gale from N. W. At
about 2 P. M. came ship to S. O. C. at about noon
took in Main top and so on.

Thu. Jan 18th

Bowmer in with heavy gale from N.W. took in
Bow Boat Row to under Foretopmast stay etc and
Main Spinnaker at 3 P.M. saw Salanda Island
bearing N.W. distant about 12 miles weather clear
and wind more moderate. Main feet blowing
heavy in squalls with rain. Sat feet clear
and hauled to 6.00 P.M. so ends.

Friday Jan. 19th

Blowing a gale from N. by W. hauling to S.W. and moderating gradually made sail to double reefed Topsail and courses a heavy sea still running. Much fast heavy squalls since N. by S. Set first clew with a strong breeze from W. by N. and heavy swell from S.W. Saw the South end of "Stewart's Island" bearing N.E. 30 E. 10 miles.

Sat Jan. 20th

Down with strong breeze from N. N. W. and suggest
sea broke out for water side. Chari great strong
breeze from N. W. and by itself. Set great strong breeze
from N. N. W. carrying sail try to hold to windward but
not anchoring any thing owing to the heavy swell some
probable some sea current as now

Sun Jan 21st

Came in with strong breeze from N.E. and very high atmosphere steering to North and N.E. Wind from fair with moderate breeze from N.E. but great foggy once the wind was this W.
