Wed. Nov. 25th
Moderate weather. Distance being A.E. dis 25
miles at sunset. Wind and Lat. part pleasant & easy

Thurs. Nov. 26th Sat. 28th
Pleasant weather wind from the Eastward. Wind part
same. Lat. part strong breeze so easy

Fri. Nov. 27th
Strong breeze from the Eastward. Wind and Lat. part
the same. So easy strong breeze

Sat. Nov. 28th
The wind still continues strong from the Eastward
"Norfolk Island" in sight being E.W.E. Wind part strong
breeze. Lat. part do same rain. Norfolk Island out of sight

Sun. Dec. 1st
Weather fine, wind light from Eastward. Distance
being A.E. by obs. at sunset. Wind and Lat. part do

Mon. Dec. 2nd
Calm and light air. Wind part moderate breeze. Lat
part off and on the lower beam. Whillson & James
Arnold in sight. During the Amble 2600. And Milton
3100

Tues. Dec. 3rd
Calm weather sent in boat and returned with orders
for another cruise in command of Mr. Hume. Sch.
Dran has from Auckland laying at anchor off the
Town. Wind and Lat. part calm and light air

Wed. Dec. 4th
Comes in with a fresh breeze from the Eastward
Distance being A.E. dis 20 miles at 3 P.M. Saw sperm
whales lowred and took one. Sent Bow Boat and
bally stove Submarine Boat. Wind part same
and whales going to windward. Took whale
along side. Lat. part cutting in.

Thurs. Dec. 5th
Fresh breeze from the Eastward. Finishing cutting
in. Wind part commencing boiling. Lat. part
boiling so ends.

Fri. Dec. 6th
Strong breeze from the Eastward. Boiling. Wind
and Lat. part do so ends.

Sat. Dec. 7th
Strong breeze from the Eastward. Boiling. Wind
part finishing boiling. Turn up 48 Bbls. Lat
part strong breeze so ends.

Sun. Dec. 8th
Strong breeze from the Eastward. Wind and Lat. part

Mon. Dec. 9th

Tues. Dec. 10th
Strong Easterly wind. Distance in sight. Rain.

Wed. Dec. 11th
Blowing a gale from the East. Under close reefed
Main Sprail. Foretopmast staysail and Main
spinnaker. Rain in abundance. Lat. part more moderate
wind S.W. steering into A.E. so ends.

Thurs. Dec. 12th
Thick weather rain running into the A.E.
in search of the land. Wind part by the
wind. Lat. part land in sight 20 miles dis
saw sperm whales going to windward. Lat
lowered whales got to windward the boats.
when called the boats aboard and made sea
ends with no whales.

Fri. Dec. 13th
Pleasant weather and fine breeze from
the S.W. saw whales again at one 130 and
at 430 lowered and pulled to windward.
Whales going quick. Came on board at sunset
Distance being 15 miles. George Colden
in sight off to leeward. Wind part working
up to leeward. Lat. part sent in
boats. Ends off and on the lower
