Friday, March 7th

Cloudy weather strong breeze from S.E. Employees
stung up chucks for water. Wind part calm. Lat part
light breeze from S.W. Employees setting up chucks
for water scrubbing ship out side.

Monday, March 31st

Good breeze from S.W. At 10 1/2 A.M. Capt and
Lady came on board got underway and proceeded
down the river. Bury stowing anchors.

Tues. April 1st

Breeze from the Southward. Brought down
the river. At 3 passed the light house at 7 P.M.
at 7 P.M. Cape Pellus bearing S.W. 15 miles dis-
tant wind S.W. course S.W. 1/2 S. Wind mod-
erate. heavy weather. Wind part pleasant. Lat
part same. Course S.W. 1/2 E. passed the whaleship
Cinder of Hobart Town bound S. One other seen in
sight. Lat 42° 24' S.

Long 148° 35' E.

Wed. April 2nd

Light breeze from the S.W. course W by E. with
all sail out. Wind part strong breeze from the
Southward. Course S.W. 1/2 E. Lat part moderate
Gale from S.E. course S.W. under whole topsails.

Thurs. April 3rd

Moderate gale from the S.E. course S.W. at
4 P.M. set the mainsail at 4 P.M. set the main
top sail. Wind and Lat part same as end.

Friday, April 4th

Moderate breeze from the Southward with squally
weather. Course S.W. Wind and Lat part same
as end.

Sat 5th

Moderate breeze and pleasant weather from S.W.
Course S.W. Wind part variable winds course
S.W. Lat part pleasant from S.W. ends.

Sun. April 6th

Moderate breeze and pleasant weather from the
Northward course S.W. All sail set. Saw
Gannets. Wind and Lat part pleasant. Hump-
backs and Gannets in sight.

Mon. April 7th

Pleasant weather wind from the Northward.
Ship heading N.W. all sail out. Wind and Lat part
calm and squally. So ends.

Tues. April 8th

Moderate breeze from the S.W. heading S.W. Ship
under double reefed topsails. Wind part squally
with some rain. Lat part pleasant. Wind from
S.W. Ship under whole topsails and courses. So ends.

Wed. April 9th

Strong breeze from the S.W. heading S.W. at 5 P.M.
passed a merchant man bound N. Lat dark shrouds
sail to double reefed topsails. Wind and Lat part same
four sails in sight.

Thurs. April 10th

Strong breeze from the S.W. heading N. Wind and
Lat part the same saw a steamer bound to the S.W.

Friday, April 11th

Long 148° 35' E.

Strong breeze and rain squalls from the S.W. heading
S.W. at 2 P.M. double reefed the topsails. at
5 P.M. took in sail to close reefed main topsails
Toward and shown sail. Wind and Lat part
same as end.

Sat. April 12th

Strong breeze from S.W. steering S.W. under double
reefed topsails. Wind part same. Lat part
moderate gale from S.W. course S.W. heavy sea on.

Sun. April 13th

Long 148° 35' E.

Moderate gale from the S.W. course S.W. Took in
gill and the topsails. and close reefed the main
squally with a heavy sea on. Wind part luffing
to the wind on starboard tack heading S. Lat part

Mon. April 14th

Lat 52° 22' S.

Gale from S.W. bent fore topsail. Long 148° 35' E.
and kept off S.W. at 4 P.M. course S.W. by N. Wind
part pleasant. Lat part do course S.W. Lat 50° 51'
Long 160° 38' E.
