

On Board Barque Sea Ranger 1871

Thursday July 3<sup>rd</sup> this day begins with a calm and light air from S.W. Middle part a moderate breeze from W. Mate and Carpenter employed in putting dogs on the top sails yards latter part took Boats off the House and stowed them back on Ship by the wind a good breeze from the Rear quarters land in sight thus ends

Friday July 4<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours come in with a calm land in sight bearing S.E. at work at my Boat Sail Mate employed at short jobs rattle down Mizzen Rigging Middle part light air from S.W. Ship by the wind to S. Mate tailed out Main top sails Bores latter part breezing from the same quarters so far so good thus ends Not very interesting 4 of July 5<sup>th</sup>

Saturday July 5<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours begin with a gentle breeze from West several sails in sight rattle down fore rigging Middle part Wind the same Ship by the Wind Standing to South took down Chain spencer Vangs latter part Winds the same all is well on board I ground one iron Washed paint work and decks

Sunday July 6<sup>th</sup> This day of our Lords begins with a very light breeze from W. Ship by the Wind with all Sail out Middle part Windy the same every thing very quiet on Board latter part the same one Sail in sight got to Steam Halls from Cooper give 3<sup>rd</sup> Mate one very clear weather thus the day ends

Monday July 7<sup>th</sup> this day begins with a calm the watch employed in making the Ship outside one Sail in sight Middle part Still a calm caught a turtle Mate set up Sit quays latter part very calm still at work on Boat Sails thus ends the day

Tuesday July 8<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours come in with a light breeze and clearing weather from S.S.W. the watch employed in breaking out water and Bread Middle part Winds the same Ship by the wind quite a number of sails in sight all done to Eastward latter part Winds the same saw some grampus and porpoises getting along with my Boat Sail Valls well depends the day

Wednesday July 9<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours come in with a fine breeze from S.W. Ship by the Wind a number of sails in sight Middle part Winds the same steering along by the wind latter part Winds the same making rope for Boat sail one Sail in sight so ends the day

Thursday July 10<sup>th</sup> this day begins with a fresh breeze from S.W. with squalls of rain at work repairing Boat Sail Middle part Winds the same Ship by the wind and much rain latter part Change of Wind to W. heavy rains cleared down top sails and shortened sail so ends the day

Friday July 11<sup>th</sup> this day begins with a fine breeze from S.W. with clearing weather the watch employed in making rope Middle part Winds the same Ship by the wind on cruising ground latter part the same of the out the run so ends the day
