

Cruising in the North Atlantic Ocean for Sperm Whales

Thursday August 21st 1877
 This day begins with a calm and light air from W. N. Ship by the wind to 1/8 the watch employed in breaking out flour middle part winds the same and ship steering the same Cooper employed in making grains for Starboard Bow Back latter part winds the same the watch employed in making sword mats nothing in sight so ends the day

Friday August 22nd
 This day begins with a fresh breeze from West Ship steering by the wind standing to North some grampus and porpoises in sight the watch employed in working in rigging middle part winds the same and ship steering the same Steward some better he is on duty latter part winds the same saw some grampus and kept off for them clothing including for the day so ends

Saturday August 23rd
 This day begins with a light breeze from West partly cloudy ship steering by the wind to North nothing in sight middle part winds the same and gaining the same one sail in sight to Eastward Boat steering off from poles latter part light air from the same gear so ends the day

Sunday August 24th
 These 24 hours come in with a fine breeze from West Ship steering North nothing in sight but some grampus middle part winds the same and ship steering the same latter part winds the same but very light some porpoises in sight clothing includes for this day so ends

Monday August 25th
 These 24 hours come in with a fine breeze West Ship steering to East the watch employed in working in rigging middle part winds the same and steering the same some grampus in sight latter part winds the same ship steering to E by North times very dull on board nothing in clothing for the day so ends

Tuesday August 26th
 These 24 hours come in with a fine breeze from West Ship steering 1/8 the watch employed in breaking out water some grampus in sight middle part winds the same and ship steering the same one sail in sight latter part winds the same Carpenter employed in making Box for Captain nothing in sight so ends the day

Wednesday August 27th
 These 24 hours come in with fresh gales from W. S. W. one sail in sight the watch at work about decks making sheet and Ocum middle part winds the same with squalls of rain ship carrying too with fore top sail fubled leather part then change of wind to N. W. still very squally clothing in sight so ends the day

Thursday August 28th
 These 24 hours come in with a fresh breeze from North with squalls rain and fog ship by the wind with fore top sail furled nothing going on board middle part change of wind to East but still moderate set fore top sail and main sail one sail in sight to East with fore top sail in latter part winds the same ship standing to North nothing else in sight so ends the day
