

July 9th. - Clear weather, but rugged. Strong breeze from the Eastward, heading S. by E. 4 P.M. saw fin backs.

July 10th. - Clear weather. Rugged. Wind strong from the Eastward. Heading S. by E. Sunset. Tacked, heading N. N. E.

July 11th. - Fresh breeze from the Eastward, heading N. by E. Main topgallant sail out. 10 1/2 P.M. tacked, heading S. E. by E.

July 12th. - Cloudy. Fresh breeze from the Northward, heading E. by S. Saw fin backs. Main topgallant sail out.

July 13th. - Rugged. Strong breeze from the N. N. W. Rainy. 9 P.M. clear weather.

July 14th. - Strong breeze from the N. E. heading E. by E. 10 A.M. tacked heading N. Noon - very rugged. Reefed topsails. Sunset, moderated.

July 15th. - Fine weather. Wind E. N. E., heading N. by E. Main topgallant & mizzen staysail out. Cloudy.

July 16th. - Fine weather. Light breeze from the Eastward, heading N. N. E. 8 A.M. tacked, heading S. by W.

July 17th. - Cloudy. Strong breeze from S. E. 7 A.M. sail off weather bow. Tacked heading N. E. 2 P.M. spoke her. It was the Bayble, from a cruise off the Bonin islands. They had taken 350 bls. this season.

Capt. Porter died about the 1st of June, and was buried at sea, after keeping his body six days in the hope of making land. They had experienced a

violent hurricane off the islands, losing three boats. They are alarmed for the safety of the ship. Hope that was known to be in the vicinity. Reported as cruising off the islands, the ships Wm. Keeton, Eliza Swift, Chilton & E. L. B. Jennings. The R. was bound to the Sandwich Islands in charge of the mte.

July 18th. - Clear weather. Strong breeze from the S. E. heading E. N. E. Bayble went out of sight astern at 4 P.M.

July 19th. - Clear weather. Strong breeze from the Southward, heading E. by S.

July 20th. - Fine weather. Fresh breeze from S. W. heading S. E. 7 A.M. tacked heading W. by S. Noon, tacked, heading S. E. 1/2 E.

July 21st. - Fine weather. Light breeze from S. W. heading S. E. by S. 9 A.M. raised a large beach off lee quarter. Ran off two hours, but seeing nothing, luffed to the wind on the southern tack. 4 P.M. wet hold.

July 22nd. - Cloudy. Fresh breeze from the S. W. heading S. E. 8 A.M. tacked, heading N. W. Sail off weather beam.

July 23rd. - Fine weather. Light breeze from S. W. heading S. W. by S. 7 A.M. tacked heading S. 1/2 E. Saw a large piece of squid. Rave now main topsail, mizzen & fore topsail braces.

July 24th. - Fine weather. Light breeze from W. S. W. heading N. W. Coal-tarred anchors. Saw squid.

July 25th. - Fine weather. Light breeze from S. W. heading W. S. W. Sunrise, sail off the lee quarter. 8 A.M. tacked, bringing the stranger a point off weather bow. Heading
