Bark Sea Shell Journal Voyage June 1860.

Monday June 4.

This day comes in with squally weather and strong
 wind from E heading N & E under reefs. Middle
 part under Short Sail Latter part under
 up so ends Lat 25.08 S

Tuesday June 5. Sun No Wls.

This day comes in with squally weather and light
 wind from N & heading N & W under reefs.
 Middle part heading E under Short Sail
 Latter part heading N & with the light
 sails furled so ends No Obs.

Wednesday June 6.

This day comes in with rain and squally weather
 light wind from N steering E with all sail
 at Middle and Latter part the same so
 ends this day Lat 25.18 S

Thursday June 7. Sun 172.45 W

This day comes in with pleasant weather and
 light wind from S steering E with all sail
 at at quarter past four saw 2 sperm whales
 5 lowered for them the Starboard
 boat went along side of one of them
 it did not get fast, took up the boats and
 the ship heading W with the light sails
 furled. Middle part Tacked at One to E
 Latter part at day light saw sperm whales
 at half past seven lowered for them at Twelve
 the boats in Chase so ends No Obs.
