

Bound Towards the Ocean Island of Sharron

Friday December 24. 1841

These 24 hours fresh breezes from the E. Steering on the wind saw
finbacks all hands employed in ships duty Lat 137.4 N Long 134.0 E

Saturday December 25. 1841

These 24 hours strong breezes from the E. N. E. to E. S. E. Steering
on the wind nothing in sight Lat 24.4 N Long 134.22 E

Sunday December 26. 1841

These 24 hours first part strong breezes later part calm and rain
from the E. N. E. to E. S. E. Steering on the wind About
6 P.M. we raised one of the Caroline Islands. There was about 120
conackers come of to us. The captain ordered the guns to be got
out and loaded and cutters. Capt Harris did not know what they
wanted to do. But they came along side. They came of to trade long
leaf tobacco, fishline and small ropes. Which we bought of them
about 3 P.M. they left us and put for the shore they were
very good natured. Lat 24.5 N Long 133.02 E

Monday December 27. 1841.

These 24 hours fresh breezes and heavy squalls of rain from S to N
E Steering on the wind nothing in sight Lat 3.30 Long 133.55

Tuesday December 28. 1841

These 24 hours fresh breezes and heavy squalls of rain from S. E.
to N. E. Steering by the wind. Nothing in sight. Boats
for Beef and Water Lat.

Wednesday December 29. 1841

These 24 hours fresh breezes from N. to N. E.
steering by the wind. Nothing in sight. Heavy squalls
of rain. Lat 25.3 N Long 136.55 E so ends this 24 hours

A Journal Kept on Board Ship Sharron

Thursday December 30. 1841

These 24 hours fresh breezes from the N. to N. E. Steering on
the wind nothing in sight. Sent down the main
Mast. topgallant sail and sent a new one and sent
down the main topgallant and mended it and sent it up again
Lat 25.5 N Long 137.56 E so ends this 24 hours

Friday December 31. 1841

These 24 hours fresh breezes and squalls from the N. W. to N. E.
steering by the wind saw Blackfish Lat 2.44 N Long 136.50

Saturday January 1. 1842

These 24 hours light breezes and heavy squalls of rain from the N. to
N. E. by N. Steering by the wind. Nothing in sight

Sunday January 2. 1842

These 24 hours light breezes from N. E. to S. E. steering by
the wind nothing in sight Lat 2.52 N Long 137.56 E

Monday January 3. 1842

These 24 hours commenced with light breezes and squalls from the
N. E. Steering by the wind saw 6 by 8 nothing in sight
at 4 P.M. broke out for Beef Pork Beans Peas Mackerels and
Water Lat by 2.18 N Long 138.52 E so ends this 24 hours

Tuesday January 4. 1842

These 24 hours strong breezes from N. E. by N. steering by the wind
saw blackfish Lat 4.01 by 8 Long 140.16 by 8

Wednesday January 5. 1842

These 24 hours strong breezes from N. E. steering by the
wind saw 8 by 8 Lat by 4.01 N Long 141.28 E
