

Round towards the Ocean Island Ship Sharon

Thursday January 6 1842

This 24 hours fresh breezes from N E steering E and E by E saw
the birds Lat 16.31 S Long by 162.15 E

Friday January 7 1842

This 24 hours light breezes from N E to N steering on the wind
saw pinbacks Lat by 16.31 S Long 162.30 E so ends this 24 hours

Saturday January 8 1842

This 24 hours fresh breezes and squally from N E to E by E
steering E by E nothing in sight Long by 163.30 E Lat 2.17 S

Sunday January 9 1842

This 24 hours strong breezes from N W steering N by E no
thing in sight Lat by 16.2 Long 163.3 E so ends this 24 hours

Monday January 10 1842

This 24 hours pleasant breezes from N W by N steering E by E
nothing in sight Lat by 16.33 S Long 166.22 E

Tuesday January 11 1842

This 24 hours pleasant breezes from N W to N E steering
by the wind caught a porpoise Lat 1.12 S Long 167.18 E

Wednesday January 12 1842

This 24 hours pleasant breezes from N E to N W steering on the
wind at ten & 10 raised Present Island Lat 33 S Long 167.11

Thursday January 13 1842

This 24 hours pleasant breezes from N steering on the wind
Present Island bearing S W - Raised Thales at 10 o'clock
& the birds in not yet past Lat 22 S Long 167.15 E

Friday January 14 1842

This 24 hours light breezes from N by E steering on the wind
Nothing in sight sent down the four topgallant and
mended it and sent it up again Lat 22 S Long 167.40 E

Saturday January 15 1842

This 24 hours light breezes from N to E steering for
whales raised whales at half past 11 & the boats four boats
and chased till four o'clock did not get past 11 & 10 raised
more boats away and did not see them again at 10 o'clock took
up the boats Lat by 16.52 S Long 167.48 E

Sunday January 16 1842

This 24 hours light breezes from N to E steering for whales
Present Island bearing S W distant about 15 miles
saw blackish Lat by 16.13 S Long 167.22 E so ends

Monday January 17 1842

This 24 hours light breezes from N steering in about 12 f miles
from the Present Island saw blackish broke out for corn

Tuesday January 18 1842

This 24 hours pleasant breezes from N E about 9 miles from
Present Island there were about 45 boats come off to trade
they brought three hogs - about 100 chickens a large quantity
of shells Thales broken shells Fish Thales Other things
too numerous to mention ends this 24 hours

Wednesday January 19 1842

This 24 hours fresh breezes from N to W with squalls of rain
steering E by E nothing in sight Opened a barrel of
cloud killed thirty chickens for dinner
