This 24 hours strong breezes from ESE steering on the wind to SE nothing in sight Lat 120° S Long 167.12 E

Monday February 28 1842

This 24 hours pleasant breezes ESE steering on the wind to the N and E nothing in sight Lat by Cr 2.20 S Long 167.16 E


Tuesday March 1st 1842

This 24 hours strong breezes from ESE steering by the wind to the N and E nothing in sight Raised land 4 or 6 Point island Lat 1.5° S Long 167.0


Wednesday March 2nd 1842

This 24 hours pleasant breezes from ESE steering by the wind At 5 P.M. raised whales heard 3 boats put off after them saw them no more came a bear at dark and took up the boats Lat 45 S Long 166.45 E

Thursday March 3rd 1842

This 24 hours pleasant breezes from ESE steering by the wind At 6 P.M. raised whales heard 4 boats put off after them the Bowboat went on and fastened on the whale bit of the line  came a bear and took up the boats Spoke the Abigail. C. C. 21 months out 14,000 lbs of sperm oil Lat 16 S Long 166.30 E

Friday March 4th 1842

This 24 hours light breezes from ESE steering on the wind to the N and E At 6 P.M. raised whales heard four boats and boat of after them did not get to them 

Saturday March 5th 1842

This 24 hours light breezes E steering on the wind nothing in sight Lat 38 S Long 166.33 E

This 24 hours light breezes from ESE steering N E by E nothing in sight Lat 00 Long 166.48 E

Monday March 7th 1842

This 24 hours pleasant breezes from SE steering on the wind to S and N nothing in sight Lat 00 00 N Long 165.80 E

Tuesday March 8th 1842

This 24 hours strong breezes from ESE steering by the wind to N and SE nothing in sight Lat by Cr 00 00 N Long 166.15 E on and this 24 hours


Wednesday March 9th 1842

This 24 hours strong breezes from ESE steering on the wind nothing in sight Lat 38 S Long 165.50 E

Thursday March 10th 1842

This 24 hours strong breezes from ESE steering on the wind to N and SE At 7 P.M. carried away the foremast back stay nothing in sight Lat 00 20 S Long 165.50 E

Friday March 11th 1842

This 24 hours strong breezes from ESE steering on the wind At 1 o'clock midship whales heard put off after them did not get near them At 5 P.M. raised more heard 4 boats the Capt went on and missed Spoke the ~~Abigail~~ Burke Fortable of ~~Pine~~ 17 months out 400 lbs of sperm oil 

Saturday March 12th 1842

This 24 hours pleasant breezes from E steering on the wind to the N and SE nothing in sight Lat 20 S Long 165.57 E
