This 24 hours light breeze from N. W. to S. E. & nothing in sight. all hands busy employed in setting up the fore-riggen Lat 8.02 S Long 169.33 E as ends

Tuesday March 29 1842

This 24 hours pleasant breeze from N. W. to S. E. & steering by the wind & nothing in sight. all hands busy employed in setting up the fore-riggen on turning in riggen Lat 8.02 S Long 170.10 E

Wednesday March 30 1842

This 24 hours fresh breeze from N. W. steering by the wind & nothing in sight. Lat 8.23 S Long 171.20 E

Thursday March 31 1842

This 24 hours fresh breeze from N. steering by the wind & all hands busy employed in turning in the main-riggen and setting up a duntopmast riggen Lat 8.46 S Long 173.00 E

Friday April 1 1842

This 24 hours fresh breeze and squalls of rain from N. W. to S. E. steering by the wind & all hands busy turning in main-riggen Lat 10.07 S Long 173.53 E

Saturday April 2 1842

This 24 hours strong breeze and squalls of rain from N. W. to S. E. steering by the wind to the S. and E. sent down the maintopmast and mended Lat 11.50 S Long 174.33 E

Sunday April 3 1842

This 24 hours strong breeze and squalls of rain. steering by the wind to the S. and E. nothing in sight Lat 12.36 S Long 175.25 E

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Monday April 4 1842

This 24 hours strong breeze from E. steering by the wind & nothing in sight Lat 12.02 S Long 175.55 E

Tuesday April 5 1842

This 24 hours pleasant breeze from E. steering by the wind to the S. & nothing in sight Lat 12.48 S Long 176.20 E

Wednesday April 6 1842

This 24 hours pleasant breeze from S. E. by E. 27 E. & the raised Bittern got up the cables and bent them and got the barboard anchor of the barge at 11.30. Lat 12.34 S Long 176.55 E

Thursday April 7 1842

This 24 hours light breeze from S. E. to E. at 2 P.M. anchored at the Island of Colomba in port. Barge Cope of London 1 masts 400 lbs. at 7 P.M. got a raft of 14 racks on shore to fill with water sent the Royal mast and Topgallant Yards down

Friday April 8

This 24 hours moderate breeze from the E. with frequent squalls of rain still lying at anchor at 3 P.M. got a draft of water and hoisted it in got off about 300 yards at 6 P.M. killed 3 Pigs as ends

Saturday April 9

This 24 hours pleasant breeze from the E. still lying at anchor in company with the barge got off 3 boats loads of wood and stowed it away with the water got a few yards and at 4 P.M. killed a Pig as ends
