

Journal kept on board of Sharon.

Friday July 1 1842

This 24 hours fresh breeze from the E steering
at 12 AM raised Present Island the coopers
came off to trade with coconuts and chickens for tobacco
also the ship bark Lagrange in company with us

Saturday July 2

This 24 hours fresh breeze from E steering the ship
run in near Present Island to trade with chickens
two ships in sight Lat 12° 23' N Long 167° 15' E

Sunday July 3

This 24 hours strong breeze from E steering by the
wind two barks in sight and Present Island in
sight Lat

Monday July 4

This 24 hours fresh breeze from E steering by the
wind Present Island in sight and 3 ships in
sight

Tuesday July 5

This 24 hours pleasant breeze from E steering by the
wind the island in sight spoke the bark Lagrange
of Fairhaven & Etatson 13 months out 100 lbs of S.C.



Wednesday July 6

This 24 hours strong breeze Present Island
in sight several canoes came off to trade 3 sails in sight

Thursday July 7

This 24 hours strong breeze from E Present Island
in sight 2 canoes came off to trade brought coconuts
and chickens shells

Of Fairhaven Capt. Harris 13

Friday June 8

This 24 hours strong breeze from E steering by the
wind Present Island in sight

Saturday July 9

This 24 hours strong breeze from E steering
by the wind to the N E nothing in sight

Sunday July 10

This 24 hours strong breeze from E steering by
the wind carried away the Gib in a squall
nothing in sight

Monday June 11

This 24 hours fresh breeze from E steering by the
wind to the S E Lat 13° N Long 167° 38' E

Tuesday July 12

This 24 hours pleasant breeze and squalls of rain from
N E to E steering by the wind to E nothing in sight
but bent a new mainmast sail and mended the
foremast sail Lat 11° 05' N Long 167° 58' E

Wednesday July 13

This 24 hours pleasant breeze from E steering by
the wind at 2 PM raised large whaling boats and
did not get fast Lat 13° N Long 168° 10' E
