

The third mate arm stuck to the bone and about 5 inches  
in length and cut the other hand very bad in the  
twile with the other man as the cutlass was between them  
when they clinched he is cut in about 12 places  
he is not able to use his arms much at present  
the one that was on the Boats looking out for the  
boat as he heard the gun he run aft with a spade  
in his hand and he could not see no one but the third  
mate saw him as he looked down in the cabin if he then  
went forward and the third mate by the name of Benjamin  
Callow then hailed the Boats to come a board as he was  
cut very bad and he had killed two as he thought then  
the Boats came along side and mister Callow come on deck  
all a goar of blood and he said that there was one  
of them down in the cabin which he expected  
was dead for he had not heard him for some time  
then the steward struck fire and light a light  
and went down in the cabin and found him up  
on the transom with a cutlass and knife in his hands  
and we went towards him to take him and he punch  
ed it towards us then the mate told us to stand  
back and he shot him then the second mate  
commenced drawing the third mates wounds and the  
rest of us went to look for the other native on deck  
but did not find him that night

Then we got a plank and laid the Capt on it  
and took him aft and laid the plank on a steering  
bait aft till the next day this was about half past  
ten P.M. the next day about half past eight  
in morning all hands was called to the waste the  
capt on was taken there and a Boat was rowed by the mate  
then he was launched overboard shortly after the mate  
told us that we must turn on and get the rigging  
and bend the sails that he cut ~~the rigging~~  
the Steward cut a drift from the yards to stop the ship

nearway by the order of the Mate. After Dinner  
he told us to search the ship for the native that  
killed the night before we went down in the fore hold  
and commenced looking and found him we told  
him to come out he would not then we comm  
enced hauling out some rigging and got to him  
then he commenced firing woods at us  
then we punched him some with a Iron pole  
which he soon come on deck then we put him  
in irons, As the reader may perceive it is not  
common for us to right two days work together but  
as I had no time to right the night before and  
then thought it best to right it in one

O may God bless the little family that the Capt on  
left at home and all the rest  
We are bound to Bay of Islands but we expect to  
stop to Rotumah to get some men and to leave  
two Co-mackers that we got there
