This 21 hours pleasant breeze from W steering E under all sail saw three
banks of blackfish Lat by 35 01 S Long 164 06

Wednesday December 22

This 22 hours pleasant breeze from N and W steering to E and S by N
saw blackfish Lat by 35 00 Long 165 06

Thursday December 23

This 23 hours light breeze from N and E steering E by N under all
sail sent a New spanker Lat by 34 50 S Long 166 38

Friday December 24

This 24 hours light breeze from N and E steering E by N saw 8 to the less
and a ship standing to Lat by 34 50 S Long 166 52

Saturday December 25

This 25 hours light breeze from N steering E by N nothing in sight
broke out for the last time Lat by 33 38 S Long 170 24

Sunday December 26

This 26 hours light breeze from N steering to the E saw blackfish
and killed and bled Lat by 33 24 S Long 171 06

Monday January 1 1844

This 27 hours light breeze from N steering to the E and N and E
All hands busy in washing and painting ship saw a ship to the
windward at 4 PM Lat by 33 24 S Long 171 06

Tuesday January 2

This 28 hours variable winds and calm all day in painting ship and
sent up the four top gallant mast in sight of three kings and one sail
in sight Lat 33 30 S Long 171 2 Wednesday January 3

This 29 hours pleasant breeze from N and W steering nothing in sight
Painting ship Lat by 33 30 S Long 172 12

Thursday January 4

This 30 hours first part light breeze later part fresh from N and W steering
to N and E at 2 PM sent a new jib and started for Bay of Islands at 6 PM
raised 3 kings Lat by 33 25 S Long 172 25

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Bound to Bay of Islands

Friday January 5 1844

This 31 hours first part fresh breeze later part light from N and W in sight
of North Cape and New Zealand 4 miles in sight so ends this 31 hours

Saturday January 6

This 32 hours first part light breeze later part fresh breeze from N and
E in sight of New Zealand bound in, two sails in sight bound in

Sunday January 7 N and W

This 33 hours light breeze from N and W bound in to Bay of Islands
At 3 PM let go anchor the Captain went a shore and sent some
Unions and Potatoes

Monday January 8

This 34 hours lying to anchor in New Zealand sent a raft of cables and
shoe for water killed a hog caught some sheepish foot three men
in rows and flogged one of them then sent them a shore to Cook
At 5 PM the Ship Hope of Providence came in to anchor to
get a new mainmast the old one being rotten took rightward

Tuesday January 9

This 35 hours lying to anchor in New Zealand in taking out and washing ship
and filled 150 bbl of water

Wednesday January 10

This 36 hours lying to anchor in New Zealand in getting off water and stored
it away and washed the vessel and scraped them

Thursday January 11

This 37 hours lying to anchor in New Zealand in getting off water and stored
it away and washed the vessel on one side

Friday January 12

This 38 hours lying to anchor got off craft of water and two outloads of wood
sent a shore and got 200 pounds of beef

Saturday January 13

This 39 hours lying to anchor in New Zealand sent a shore on liberty

Sunday January 14

This 40 hours lying to anchor in New Zealand sent a shore on liberty
More Anderson came a board in liquor and wanted his discharge and took
his things and went a shore
