

At Sea December 15th 1856 North Atlantic
middle part heavy squalls of wind and
rain parted over wind. maine tacks and
jib sheets at 2 PM pulled the mainsail
and fore topsail and close reefed the main
there being but a light breeze at the time
at 4 PM hoisted the fore topsail and mizen at 7
PM pulled the mizen very dark during the fore
part of the night winds. Lat 36.42

At 14th these twenty four hours commenced
with squally weather the sea and middle part of
the day double reefed topsails mainsail and jib
at 1 PM all hands employed in getting the
cables in on respective places at 3 PM all
hands hauled up the mizen and on ship
account of a squall which passed astern before
four light breeze nothing worth of notice to
the remainder of the day Lat 36.45

At 16th these twenty four hours commenced
with a moderate breeze all hands on deck through the
day employed changing the day in hauling out
between decks. Steaming on the wind. middle and
latter part much the same Lat 36.50

At 17th these twenty four hours commenced
with a light breeze all sail set steaming on the wind
working to the southward. the sea is light
of the water. maine middle and middle part
much the same latter part quite Lat 36.51

At 18th these twenty four hours commenced
with a squally weather middle and latter part
wind very light. all hands on deck and
through the day in hauling out between
decks Lat 36.52

At Sea December 23rd 1856 North Atlantic
These twenty four hours commenced with
a light breeze all sail set steaming on the
southward and eastward. all hands on deck
through the day employed through the day in
hauling out the fore topsail and the mizen
in hauling out ship in the sun died a
light breeze steaming about 3 PM middle
and latter part much the same Lat 36.52

At 19th these twenty four hours commenced
with a light breeze middle part much the same
employed through the day in the day
in shaping gear and getting the fore tops
sail ready. all sail set. latter part
latter part much the same Lat 36.53

At 20th these twenty four hours commenced
with a light breeze from the southward
and eastward. employed through the day
in working in the after and main
masts of the stern loops and fresh water
the sail set steaming on the wind. wind
from the southward and eastward. latter part
much the same Lat 36.54

At 21st these twenty four hours commenced
with a light breeze employed through the
day in hauling out the fore topsail after
noon but did not find it. middle and
latter strong breeze. same as the twenty
four hours Lat 36.55

At 22nd these twenty four hours commenced
with a strong breeze and heavy showers of
rain. double reefed the topsails. at 6 PM
all sail employed through the day in
