

*Sandwich Islands and North Pacific Ocean*  
 number of miles. latter part strong breeze  
 we reached in about 11 fathoms of water. so ended  
 this day with a strong breeze. we anchored with  
 the barbed anchor and gave her the head cable

June 19th these 24 hours commenced with a summer  
 like day. at 4 PM. commenced taking in  
 jibsails (about 60 barrels) at dark hove up and  
 got underway. set head topsails a main topsail  
 when about 4 miles from Tahaina took strong  
 breeze. closed up topgallant sail and close down  
 the topsails. being by now the fore part of the  
 night with her topsails were down in the  
 cap. got the anchors lashed at 9 PM. so ended

June 20th these 24 hours commenced with a strong  
 breeze at daylight we made all sail at 8 AM. took  
 away the waist boat and went ashore at Honolulu  
 to get letters. I received two, skimming the  
 middle and latter part much the same  
 all sail set steadily sails low and a light  
 ship one man forward. and also there the  
 day previous to Tahaina one of them for  
 a steward.

June 21st these 24 hours commenced with a light breeze  
 all sail set steering West. the fore part. hove  
 in sight all day. the carpenter employed in  
 down sheathing the Decks employed in grinding  
 irons. middle and latter part much the same.

June 22nd these 24 hours commenced with a calm  
 all sail set came at 11 AM. the two to two of the  
 Sandwich Islands in sight one of each  
 quarter. employed through the day in mending  
 the cold foresail and mainsail. in the

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June 23rd all hands to work on the sails  
 middle and latter part of these twenty four  
 hours much the same. Lat 22.24 N Long 161.22 W

June 24th these 24 hours commenced with a calm  
 employed in the morning in finishing the  
 fore and mainsail. sent down the main topgallant  
 sail so on some chafing gear and bent it again  
 at 10 AM. commenced to make out the oil and  
 paper to finish the stowing back again. at 4 PM.  
 were by the Hall sail set. studding sails set low  
 and left. middle and latter part much the  
 same. so ended. Lat 23.52 N Long 161.22 W

June 25th these 24 hours commenced with a  
 moderate breeze all sail set. wind from the  
 southward and westward. at 10 AM. hove in the  
 wind. barbed tack aboard. middle part strong  
 breeze. took in fore and main topgallant sail  
 at 10 PM. set them again. latter part light breeze  
 Lat 25.28 N Long 162.24 W

June 26th these twenty four hours commenced  
 with a light wind. employed through the day  
 in mending the cold fore topsail. middle part  
 calm. with a cold swell on the Carpenter  
 employed in making the scanty larger  
 latter part much the same so ended.

Lat 25.11 N Long 163.11 W

June 27th these 24 hours commenced with a calm  
 employed through the day in mending  
 the cold main topsail. middle and  
 latter part much the same.

Lat 26.16 N Long 162.22 W

June 28th these 24 hours commenced with  
 a strong light breeze steering to the north
