

Sea. Ochotsk Sea June 22nd 1854.

Entered the Strait by 4 PM. were through the str. a good breeze. all sail set. topmasts and lower studding sails set. Steaming. At 11 PM. in the morning push the tubed bow and on the water. at 3 PM. were down the cable, with the application of one person which was stuck on the wire. The latter part strong breeze, the water indicating a strong easterly wind. so ends the day. (Ship time. Monday.)

Monday 29th these 24 hours commenced with a strong breeze at 4 PM. took in the light sails at 1 PM. double reefed the top sail and took in the main top sail at 11 PM. double reefed main top sail. a heavy sea getting rough. Steaming. No observation through the day. a steady breeze. most of the day. at 9 PM. kept her to the wind. headed about S.E. (on account of the sea) latter part strong breeze. so ends this day.

Tuesday 30th this day commenced with a strong breeze and a heavy sea on. at 2 PM. set the foresail and main top sail. after daylight shaken the reefs and shaken out main top sail and set staves. Steaming. with light wind and thick fog. middle part light breeze. latter part strong breeze all sail set. so ends the day.

Wednesday 1st July these 24 hours commenced with a moderate breeze at 1 PM. hauled the top sails at 11 PM. double reefed top sails and hauled the main sail. thick fog at 7 PM. set the main sail at 11 PM. set the whole top sails and main top sail. no observation through the day. latter part much the same.

Thursday 2nd July these 24 hours commenced with moderate breeze all sail set. at 8 PM. set top sails. and set down the studding sail boom. employed through the day in taking out water and head. for part the

Ochotsk Sea July 2nd 1854. were down the cable. middle part let up some. killed three pigs. at 10 PM. for the fourth latter part nearly calm. thick fog. no observation. day 5-6-8 1854

Friday 3rd July these 24 hours commenced with a light breeze. all sail set. on the latter part. working to the wind. employed the fore part of the day in sending down the fore top sail. main top sail. and royal mast. celebrated a day a little by firing a few guns. latter part much the same. no observation. (in calm) day.

Saturday 4th July these 24 hours commenced with a light breeze all sail set. Steaming. on the day. at 3 PM. raised a sail about the fore part. at 11 PM. middle and latter part much the same. 5-6-22 1854

Sunday 5th July these 24 hours commenced with a light breeze. all sail set. Steaming. on the day. working to the wind. middle and latter part moderate breeze. Lat 57° 20' N Long 150° 30' E. T. S. S. S.

Monday 6th July these 24 hours commenced with a moderate breeze all sail set. Steaming. on the day. heading to the north and eastward. at 11 PM. raised a white whale. got the boat up. but did not lose. middle and latter part much the same. Lat 57° 20' N Long 150° 30' E.

Tuesday 7th July these 24 hours commenced with a light breeze all sail set. Steaming. on the day. heading to the north and eastward. the wind varying from N.W. to S.W. employed the latter part of the day in taking out water. sunrise at 3 PM. sunset at 9 PM.
