

54 North East Gulf. July 16. 1857

commenced this morning to make three watches. from 1 PM. to 1/2 past 1 PM. had two watches on deck. guarded with the Brig Leverett. again left to end this day.

July 17th this day commenced with a moderate breeze all sail. steering on the wind. gained again wind with the Brig. middle part strong. breeze here two watches on deck some part of the night. steering out of the bay. so end this day.

Sunday 19th. Ship's time. this day commenced with a strong breeze at 4 AM. in the evening began sail and flying jib. at 8 AM. one watch more taken below. a great number of California Gags. seen in sight (whale) hand toward the starboard head a bird to shoot a lance at one but did not get a chance. middle and latter part very light.

Lat 11° 10' N Long 107° 10' W
Monday 20th. this day commenced with a light breeze all sail set. two sails in sight one of them resembles a man of war. a plenty of California Gags in sight. at daybreak and latter part much the same. Lat 11° 45' N Long 107° 10' W

Tuesday 21st. this day commenced with a moderate breeze all sail set. the fore part of the day thick fog nothing worthy of notice through the day. at 1 PM. sailed land of the bay. middle and latter part much the same.

Wednesday 22nd. this day commenced with a strong breeze all sail set. flying jib. thick fog through the day. at 11 AM. set log and wind with flying jib. middle and latter part much the same.

55 Cohotsk Sea July 23. 1857. Ship's time

Thursday 23rd. this day commenced with a light breeze all sail set. steering on the wind. foggy. most of the day. one sail in sight. at night sounded and round up. later part of the day the hunter with the same.

Friday 24th. this day commenced with a light breeze all sail set. steering to the southward and westward. in the morning made land. employed the fore part in hauling out water. Beavers. Bay. at 1 PM. took in main log and land and flying jib. at 1 PM. sailed again. at 1 PM. from the Ship Cohotsk. two whales seen.

Saturday 25th. this day commenced with a light breeze all sail set. thick fog all through the day. nothing worthy of notice through the day.

Sunday 26th and Monday 27th. nothing worthy of notice. moderate breeze and thick fog all day. at night it lit up some snow that we could see about three miles off. at night steady rain all the fore part of it.

Tuesday 28th. this day commenced with a strong breeze all sail set with the exception of the courses. at 1 PM. made land. at 1 PM. saw holes could see some bear heads. at 10 AM. thick fog and rain. middle part strong latter part wind and rain.

Lat 12° 10' N Long 107° 10' W
Wednesday 29th. this day commenced with a light breeze and rain. sounded several times through the night. about 2 PM. of water. at 4 AM. anchored in 18 fathoms. fished the sails and
