

Mon 2nd these twenty four hours commenced with a strong breeze under double reefed topsails. Discharged the crew, and Third Officer, in the afternoon took on board about 50 bushels of potatoes (I should judge) middle and latter part braced very strong, and well to the eastward.

Tues 3rd this day commenced with a strong breeze under double reefed topsails, as before the fore part of the day, in making out a jib, sent in the cable and and sent another, at 1 PM sent the Starboard boat in and she brought up the damage, for three more than the Capt had ship today. The latter part of the twenty four hours the trade appeared to be further to the north, and very so strong, and we also got one shooting gun ship arriving two parts, most of them doing well.

Wed 4th these twenty four hours commenced with a fresh breeze, wind about 10 miles under double reefed topsails the fore part of these twenty four hours at 2 PM shook out the reefs, lying up and on several ships arrived here to day. I have felt quite unwell for the past two days, my head (stomach) being out of order, at 5 PM the Capt came on board in two ships, and stood of the Starboard I.S.C. at 7 PM under reefed topsails at 9 PM the main topsails, latter part strong breeze braced up sharp on the wind.

Thurs 5th these twenty four hours commenced with a fresh breeze, wind a heavy head sent out at daylight shook out the reefs and sent main, top and sails, at 1 PM laid away.

Fri 6th this day commenced with a moderate breeze, main, top and sail set, steering full and by, spray through the, employed the fore part, in making out some middle and latter part, much the same Lat 17° 32' N Long 158° 13' W.

Sat 7th these twenty four hours commenced with a moderate breeze, all sail set, and sail in, employed through the day in, covering the house with canvas, and painting middle and latter part, much the same Lat 15° 43' N Long 157° 15' W.

Sun 8th these twenty four hours commenced with light breezes, all sail set, steering to the southward and eastward, the ships employed through the day in reading fore and aft, nothing worthy of notice through the day, middle and latter part, much the same Lat 14° 43' N Long 157° 48' W.

Monday 9th these twenty four hours commenced with a light breeze, employed through the day in fixing the topsails, fore and aft, middle and latter part, strong breeze Lat 13° 20' N Long 157° 08' W.
