

Off and on Honolulu for March

At 12 M. board the S. B. boat and with a fair at night double reefed topsails. strong breeze. whole topsails set with the exception of one. through the night we several ships topsails singled reefed. which was done if and on. nothing worthy of notice. through the remainder of the day and night

Thurs. the 20th 24 hours commenced a light breeze. the fore part of these twenty four hours being off and on. nothing worthy of notice. through the few past days. the wind has been rather light. most of it time since we have been here. at about 9 M. our last came on board. the back window of M. which sailed a few days previous to that for the Coho. wind here again this morning. making from 100 to 150 fathoms for now cause of the leak of the vessel is not unknown. on Monday the 21st I received 5 letters from home and one from a ship in Honolulu

Sat. 19th these 24 hours commenced with a strong breeze. at 6 AM. took in maintopgallant sail. and stowed the chain cables. and lashed the anchors. at 12 M. spoke the Barque Shark of New London eight months and 9 black fish. made Aloua. run in for it. about 1 hour. and then squared the yards. keeping her by compass. latter part strong breeze. square yards.

Lat 21 1/2 N Long 159 45

Sat 20th these 24 hours commenced with a strong breeze. wind about E. steering W by S. employed through the day in drawing yarns. and baking out the sails. and getting the boats ready. mid and latter part much the same. Lat 20 58 N

Long 159 40

Sunday 21st these 24 hours commenced with a strong breeze. whole topsails set steering W by S. mending the main topsail. and at 10 AM. and latter part much the same. Lat 21 1/2 N Long 159 40
