

Farrest Bay July 1358

(the fourth we celebrated by firing three guns although it was on the third our ships time as we did not change a day when we crossed the meridian we are one day behind time) cut the whole in the same night we got him on the 6th two boats went up to the head of the bay arm of the bay saw no whales. the two starboard boats have gone on shore. including the Capt. on the 7th the boats other not from the bay a fresh breeze on the 8th fresh breeze and steady rain. going with one anchor ahead in 11 and 1/2 fathom of water. and about 66 or 70 fathom of strain cut at 8 AM. cawled hands hauled up the starboard cable. and sent down the starboard cutting fall. in order to put in the cable so as to take some of the strain off the wireless. but did not put in on account of the winds ground down.

July 9th these 24 hours commenced with a fresh breeze and a heavy swell. at 3 AM. very moderate. at 4 past 5 AM. had after a hot it came on to blow again and increased on board.

July 10th these 24 hours commenced with a moderate breeze. about 9 AM. the two starboard boats came on board. 10 AM. fresh breeze and a moderate sea on. at 1 PM. carried away the wireless part. latter part more moderate. and a plenty of rain. sent down the cutting fall and put it on the cable.

July 11th these 24 hours commenced with a moderate breeze. at 1 PM. a boat from the shore came on board. and had to get all night on account of the winds blowing very hard the latter part. and a abundance of rain.

anchored off Fabius Island. July 13th 1858 employed. through the fore part of the day breaking out water and bread.

July 12th this day commenced with a moderate breeze. at 4 AM. the waist and bow boat board and went ashore. and got about salmon from the Son Goose Indians. changing bread soap and cloth for fish. and returned back to the ship again about 11 AM.

July 13th this day commenced with a light breeze. at 1 AM. cawled all hands. bore up and made sail for Fabius island. at 6 AM. came to an anchor in 11 fathom of water. about one half mile from the shore.

July 14th this morning commenced to make out the fore hole. after pipe hooks. 9 heads & hoops. the Cooper employed in setting them up. the waist boat is ashore. building a tent (with the assistance of a boat's crew from the ship (Cicero) which the two boats men and intends to whale from ashore on shores. and the ships to go with.

July 15th employed the fore part in breaking out shovels. & the Cooper sent ashore to stay by got 4 four barrels of beef two of boards of pipes. the latter part of this day thick fog. the S. B. Boat came aboard to stay. and made a short stay and then went away again on another journey. I don't know where. & the Capt is now ashore in the by town.

July 16th this day we were employed in getting of water and stowing it down. sent ashore once two rats.
