Mon 26th. this day commenced with a

strong breeze at 10 AM. shaved off the

and stood up towards Dow. Doby Sound

about 2 or 3 PM. if fired at a pitiless degree

and did not touch him. but why not

do not know for it had a tolerable good

chance. I should judge him to be about
10 fathoms up. and for a little swell in
have now no more. or rather but little
with in them. (I mean the shooting part)
latter part nearly calm. this morning
the ships came to anchor off the N. W. part
of the island

Mon 27th this day commenced with a
light breeze. left Doby Sound this morning
and one or two whales on our passage
but they were going tolerable quick
and we having but little wind they soon
made their escape. at 7 PM. I picked up
a dead seal. while walking along
the beach. latter part fresh breeze.

Mon 28th this day commenced with a light breeze
and breakfast at 3 AM. and about 4 AM. started for Sound
knowing. if Canette point we saw two Bow heads.
but did not get very nigh them. and then we
went up as far as Jefferys point and there
saw 8 eight or 10 more. I then changed sides
with Mr. Jackson. as he intended to use the gun
thinking that probably he might shoot straighter
than myself. we took one head and head. but
instead of shooting at him first he intended to put
iron in him first. but just as he was coming
under the head of our boat. I suppose that he
saw something and down he went. kept going
long and at night brought up at Sound.

Th 29th this day commenced with a light breeze
from the southward and eastward. middle and
latter part thick fog and a strong breeze.
secured a few Fatmors. but they were not
fat as we had them.
