

Aug 20th. this day we went up to George's point
to believe. (as we have been gone now most of the time we
have none of late, and as I have not had time to write of late, I do not recollect much what happened
that day and so I shall not say much about it.)

Aug 21st. this day commenced with a strong breeze
around the island. but about 4 AM it was
marked calm. Mr Jackson got up to Gean's point first this morning, and went on a small boat
struck him solid with two rods. but unluckily
the first iron drew and the other one the short way and soon landed him up. but he was
boiling hot (as we suppose). Mr Stratton went towing, got him about half way
rescued him about 5 hours, and then the tide came ahead down under
that we saw of him he was about a breast of land and we laid by him all night while Mr
Stratton, at evening tide we saw him more than ashore. strong breeze through the night
at about 5 AM he went on a large whale. I shot a gun iron in him and soon saw him
scent iron in him. the gun iron I think went into his hip. he went down back
out a few fathoms more than the box was found that he was lost. hauled in
our line and found that the gun iron had at it. the other boat came soon. got him
back. no boat at this time being in sight of us. chased whales until dark. and then
then under took to land. but on the account of a bar we did not land. but anchored
of a bar we did not land. but anchored the boat and slept in the boat. I think that
whale that I shot was about 150 barrel and the other one, about 100 by the crews tell
Jan 22. this day commenced with a moderate breeze. saw several whales. of California bluffs
at night came home. two ships at anchor. it was impossible to get home although we
Jan 23. this morning, I coiled a small line for Mr Stratton's boat. I while he was shot at that. but after noon the ships
and carried the barrel of meat on board. rain rain rain

George in order to exchange for bread and
we started for California bluffs at night we
went ashore and left while the other came home.
Jan 24th. this day commenced with strong breeze
wind blew so that we could not see any whaling
around the point until nearly night to see if
the wind would not go down. but as it did not
started for Subic's island. when a ton of grain
what. and Mr Jackson we went on and stay
and soon landed him up. but he was
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
