

Ship this day commenced with a strong breeze and steady rain. this morning Mr Jackson went down to the wharf and so aboard of the vessel. at about 2 AM the tide turned fair and then we hauled in and laid out up to Grannette point but saw nothing. but as he was started up some and anchored his boat of the point and lost his wind being ahead. we were obliged to lay anchor. the men ashore have been an anchor and then warp him in until employed in boiling and scraping after dark when we pulled our anchor from. at night two sails in sight last one yesterday down of the point. latter coming from the Southward one of them part cold and disagreeable. the rest boiling. latter part strong breeze from of the mountains being covered with snow.

July 28th this day commenced with a light air. as soon as the whole floated we warped him up to our old station. at ten water took of the blubber with the exception of that under him and and his head at night commenced to boil standing. boaters through the night.

July 29th this day commenced with a light air from the Westward. crawled out the water at 4 AM and finished cutting in the water at this low water. employed through the day in boiling. we find the cash very poor and it is hard work to make them light tight.

July 29th this day very moderate with a few drops of rain. air very chilly in the morning. the tops of the mountains have been covered with snow since the 26 of this month. employed boiling.

Mon 30th this day commenced with a moderate breeze from the Westward employed boiling. at 4 AM raised a whale

shaved of one boat and gave chase with no success.

July 31st this day commenced with a moderate breeze. Mr Jackson took his boat and went up to Grannette point but saw nothing. but as he was started up some and anchored his boat of the point and lost his wind being ahead. we were obliged to lay anchor. the men ashore have been an anchor and then warp him in until employed in boiling and scraping after dark when we pulled our anchor from. at night two sails in sight last one yesterday down of the point. latter coming from the Southward one of them part cold and disagreeable. the rest boiling. latter part strong breeze from of the mountains being covered with snow.

Aug 1st this day commenced with a light breeze from about N. N. E. and continued most of this day. I took the boat this morning and went across a coast to the main land and brought over to me which were traveling from Towally down to Doby town. this morning there was an earthquake raised here by being a large bore near our dwelling this afternoon six or 8 of them started look for him but could not see him. employed the fore part of this day in copying the oil. and scraping the bone. tumbled very much to day with the forth ash.

Aug 2nd this day commenced with a strong breeze. started this morning for Doby town. when about two miles from the island we had two whales chased them about two hours and then gave them up. at 8 PM went ashore to Doby town and slept all night.

Aug 3rd this day commenced with a light breeze from the westward. started this morning
