

Fabius Island. Sept 14th

Sept 14th this day commenced with a moderate breeze: went up to Grannette point but saw nothing. Sept 15th went up to Grannette but saw nothing with the exception of a hare.

Sept 16th this day commenced with a light breeze from the north and eastward. Had a whale to day of the island. The latter part went and set two guns in order to shoot a hare.

Sept 17th this day commenced with a light breeze. went up to the river to day but saw nothing. at night went ashore and shot all night. heard of the Sharon. four whales.

Sept 18th this day commenced with a strong breeze from the north. at about 11 A.M. the Sharon dropped her anchor. the Capt came ashore and then went on board again and then went down to Toby Town. and as he was going down he met the 2nd mail and he went back with the Captain.

Sept 19th this day commenced with a moderate breeze. went up to Grannette point. saw one whale on our passage up there. George heading Mr Jackson's boat. Mr Jackson came back to day from Toby Town.

Sept 20th this day commenced with a strong breeze went up to Grannette point saw nothing. latter part quite a squall on. the Capt came back to day. at night I went on board of the Sharon and took supper and was ~~greatly~~ greeted by my

ship mates. on the 14th the Ship "Hibernia" arrived here from Joy Cape see this season.

Sept 21st this day commenced with a light breeze went to work and rafted the oil and at night it of. and lost one cask by its getting stove being so up. the ship getting water and putting up. to day Capt King put Mr Curfewood of duty.

Sept 21st this day commenced with a light breeze. a boat came in from the ship and took the loan. and then we all took of our best and bedding. Capt King and Mr Jackson took 6 bags ashore 49 pounds a bag. one bag of soap one chest of tea and what else I don't know. the cooper is employed in shocking the cask ashore. employed on board of the ship in stowing down water and getting of another raft of water. in morning Mr Curfewood the first officer of the Sharon left us and went on board of the Ship "Hibernia".

Sept 22nd this day commenced with a strong breeze from about E.N.E. with rain in the course of the day we stowed our water and got the Starboard anchor ready to let go. with and latter part of day strong breeze. on the 21st the Bark "Averet" arrived here with 20 of this season. Captain King to Toby Town also.
