Ship Sharon Honolulu Feb 24th 1859
 The 24th this day commenced ^{very} raining
 and continued so through the day. The Brig
 Commodore Glasgow and the Bark
 Adelaide arrived here to day. Bark from
 San Francisco and brought the home Mail
 the Adelaide was 21 day ^{consuming} from San Francisco

On 20th this day commenced rather rainy
the middle part very pleasant. at 10 AM.
took the boat and went ashore, carrying Mr.
right in charge of close, and I found him
as I considered, very sick, and there went
down to the Post Office, after letters but was
very disappointed in not finding any from
home. got found one from Lahaina
dated December 5th 1846. came on board and
immediately answered it

Sat 26th This day commenced quite fine
 employed some part of the day in helping
 Carpenter ship and unship the Winless
 rigging a thimble in the rigging bay
 of some ropes sweep of decks. and so forth
 evening made Mrs Crabb a visit a
 man of eminent Pitty. who has been
 sick but now is recovering. she also sent
 bunch of Tracts by me. for one of the
 others to distribute to the Hospital.
 enjoyed myself very much during my
 visit. at 11th Mr Foster cared is composition
 of winless plates asked. and also one
 for ^{seven} days previous to this making 16 in

Sun 27th the tide commenced very fine
nothing worthy of notice to day

Nov 28th This day with fine weather
men went to the ship to paint the
hainter from shore helping us (to
paint inside) we are painting her
in cream color. ^{the ship is} ^{arrived} here
the day the ship Polar Star. brig *Bohola*
