

Ship Sharon Honolulu March
at 10 AM went up to the Seamen's and
brought of those two barrels,

Twelfth employed the fore part of the day
taking the rigging down and putting up
in the proper place, at 11 AM the Boatman
Charles came on board and helped me the
remainder of the day forenoon. & we all
lashed up the spare gear. at 4 PM I went
ashore and bought of the Medicine Chest
a set of rowlocks from J. Spencer. at 4 PM
received a letter from home dated 18th
Robert. ashore to day having a run round

Thirteenth this morning the two stewards
& Cook were on board. at 1 PM Mr
came on board and brought of 6 Manakoa
broke out the sails and took the courses
Main Top sail and No. 3. Gullard sail
very squally with rain through the day
at 4 PM broke out one barrel of Flour
some vinegar & molasses, at night attended
the Bethel Church. this day about 11 AM
the Adelaide sailed for S. F. & Co. and
Clipper Ship Fleet Wind arrived from S. F.
this evening very stormy although a
large Moon

Sh 14th this morning Mr Lyman
came on board and Charles the Boatman
and 7 Manakoa, and one white man
took dinner and supper on board of
our ship. employed through the fore part
of the day in putting up the fore sail
of the ship. at 1 PM I went ashore
to the Gibbs & J. J. M. Sta sail, per found the
part in setting up the Gibbs quilt and fore
and backstays. & a cold. rather very blow with
frequent showers. so ends this day

14th this morning Mr Lyman came on board
at 7 AM per the fore top sail and then set
the jib gages & J. J. M. backstays, at 3 PM
bought a barrel of Salmon ashore, at night quite

15th at 9 AM the harbour Master came on
board. I went ashore and got to the makers
at about 10 AM. Mr. Fisher the first officer
came on board with 6 more Manakoa. have
head on the head chaise. in when in the act
to taking it out, the winch beam broke
and Mr Fisher went to work putting in a
round headed beam, dropped her astern and
for lay one anchor ahead and one under
the stern. & a line out of the stern, to the
Barnes. fore, at 5 PM went ashore and
bought of five barrels of sand, and about
6 PM when down to supper the Manakoa
took the bait and went ashore with her.
took supper in the storeroom to night we
had four bottles and our supper consisted
of beef & potatoes, received one letter to day from
the Manakoa not to take the bait
upheld down to supper they took
bait and went ashore, one Boatman
and one parashand slept on board all
night

16th this commenced with a
strong breeze, the Carpenter came on board
to put near and fitted some pieces
and went into the Samson bit. brails very
strong through the day, this morning
when the boat came back I found that
the four rowlocks was gone and also
one one, at 6 PM visited Sister Cook
and got a lot of books & some papers, had
very good visit although short.

17th this day commenced with a
strong breeze. at 8 PM went ashore and
bought a box of things such as
