

Ship Steamer "H. Amisatta Sea

and hoisted the mainsail. kept the ship at
wind ship heading west and on the weather side
ground at 10 AM the water was below at 6 steps
large quantities of water over the lee bow at 6 AM
left port of about two points at 7 AM the wind
gradually went down to a moderate breeze at 8
went on the port the mizzen staysail, and commenced
to make sail, at 11 AM had up the mizzen
I & sails set at 12 noon commenced the staysail
at 1 PM joined with the Montserrat. employed
during the afternoon mending studding sails
at 4 PM set out studding sails to mizzen
foresail, latter part of this 24 hours moderate
steering to the north and westward wind
about E N E. Lat 55° 35' N

Then by these 24 hours commenced with
 a moderate breeze. Ice floated through the
 day in increasing quantities. At 12 M. York
 and gamel with the Polar Star. Three
 whales they came. At 6 P.M. sent in the ice
 and bent another, storing N.W. wind
 about E. at 9 P.M. the Monticell about
 3 miles astern, rather than moderate.

Lat 57th 57. Sp Long 173rd 50
 That afternoon we commenced with a new
 haul. all sail set. (studding sail) steering to
 the northward and westward. laid the start to
 boat twice today in order to catch a seal,
 at 4 P.M. gauled with the Montreal sloop
 today in mending sails. middle and latter
 part much like the first. Lat 57th 40. Sp

By 4 1/2 there twenty four hours comes
with a moderate breeze and thick fog.
at 6 AM nearly clear. two sails in sight
steering N W by W. employed to day
making a cover covering to the by over
and mending sails. at 2 PM I used strap
up and took in studding sails

found to the Arctic Ocean & at 50

On 9th the 24 hour commenced with a light
frost and continued so through the 24 hours
employed in mending a leak bladders
at 4 P.M. set up the jib & the jib stays
and then twenty four hours Lat 41.14 N
Long 176.00 W

On 10th the day commenced with a
light air, mild part nearly calm, calm
at 8 P.M. gamed with the Montreal
rather part thick fog and a strong
breeze stirring to the S. nor'ard and
Westward wind about 5 P.M. Lat 43.13 N
Long 176.00 W

Month the 24 hours commenced with a strong breeze and thick fog, steering to the north and the wind about S. employed in making up between decks and putting some sails in case. at 2 P.M. bent the top of G. Sprail, and set it, running with the studding sail out. at 4 P.M. spoke the Montreal

On 12th then 24 hoire com. moved with a
light breeze and continued so through the day
at 6 AM. raised ice and land also. at 9 AM.
saw a small cauld him a bow head. but
as it came in thick we were obliged to
back ship and stand away from him
to prevent the ship from going in the
ice, employed through the day in pinching
down ~~back~~ on each him. Lat
Long

On 13th there 24 hours commenced with a light breeze and thick fog at 6 AM. at 10 AM. we went to sea and raised a sail three points forward of the weather beam at 11.30 AM. she gunned with N. Mont. and we allowed she proved to be the Bark Cleone of N.B. from Kodiack. nothing this season, at 1 PM. hoisted three sails
