

Bemarrks on board Ship Tharoon  
at 9 AM. went in over the reef in the Honolulu  
harbour. at 11 AM. received eight Letters from  
the M. G. in anchoring we let go the best  
bower (the S. Starboard anchor) the employment  
through the remainder of the day has been very so  
at night most all hands went ashore at 8 PM.  
attended the Bethel. weather quite warm

The 27th this day commenced very pleasant  
employed to day in painting ship. at 11 AM.  
mailed a letter for home. several of our  
men is now on shore. I believe without  
doubt. to do Robert went to a doctor to see  
about his arm

The 28th at 6 AM. the Harbour master came  
on board. manded the wind to blow up and  
except along side of the Black Sea. and com-  
menced to discharge oil about 9 AM. Williams  
the coal steerman ashore he having worked his last  
day out. the day the Francis Parmer sailed for  
San Francisco

The 29th employed in discharging oil. the  
crew leaving daily. weather very warm  
and sultry

The 30th very pleasant. nothing worth of  
notice

Mon 31st employed to day in discharging  
oil. finished discharging towards the close of  
the day. employed several Kanakas to do  
some of the men refusing to work. and they  
were sent ashore

Tues November 1st very little doing on  
board to day. with the exception of one or two  
on board of the Black Sea. tending the Hoop.  
this day most of the men were discharged

Capt J. H. Swift Honolulu Oct  
27th 1859

Went ashore this morning at 8 AM. before breakfast  
the Harbour Master came on board. took the  
anchor and wind. the ship around and  
moored her. putting the small anchor stern and  
the heavy one at the bow took breakfast at  
12.30 PM. at 12 AM. asked for my discharge  
had it promised to me. at 6 PM. walked up to a  
bar and drank a glass of soda water it being  
the first glass of any kind that I ever drank  
in a bar. was ashore during the after noon  
at Cooks Sea at the Sailors Home  
at 5 PM. received \$12 from Mr Pope on my  
wage.

The 3rd rather rainy not doing much to day

The 4th the day commenced very pleasant  
this morning in painting 15 fifteen inches of the  
color on the port side at 6 AM. Mr Edwards the  
first officer came on board. went on shore and  
got 6 Kanakas. and commenced to stow the  
main hatch

The 5th employed to day in making out  
small casks to stow for the ground 5 or 6  
Kanakas and the first officer to work. latter  
part cleared up decks and washed the eye doors.  
Mr Lynch went ashore the day previous to this

Mon 7th employed in making out casks and empty  
them and stowing them down received on board 60 barrels  
of water to day. and 6 six barrels of Molasses which we  
put into 60 gallon casks. this day the Lottan came on  
board and went to work

Tues 8th employed to day in making out casks and stowing  
them down in the Main hatch. received to day  
barrels more of Molasses. put it in to small casks.

Mon 9th employed this morning in stowing down some  
Molasses and other ship stores in the after hold
