

June the 6 A.D. 1840

Saturday the 6 comes in with strong gales from South
steering N.W. employed in Shipduty we at night
doubled reefed the fore and main top sail and furled
the mainsail middle part strong gales were later
N.W. latter part light breeze from the main with
sea ran a mile and a half in 2 1/2 hours.

Sunday the 7th commencing with strong gales from
South steering. I started for the the Shell
New Bedford 14 months out 1304 B. of shore and
the Captain came aboard middle part steering &
under way we ran and maintained sail faster
just made sail so out at 20 25 40

Monday the 8 comes in with moderate breeze and
clearing & middle part steady. N. N. & W. latter
part much the same in company with the
W. N. W. so ends at 24-45 Long 73

Monday the 9 comes in with strong breezes from
E & steering N by E at night shortened sail
midnight the same latter part made sail
saw the land so ends Lat 25 Long

Wednesday the 10 comes in with strong breeze from S. steering E. V. in company with the Nile middle light wind shifted N. N. W. latter put made all sail shored. V. saw plenty of porpoises and humpback 20 ends

June the 11th A.D. 1846

Monday the 11 comes in with light breezes from
south. Morning & middle part the same
rather part saw humbirds and cranes
at ends of at 20. The main land in sight
set of black ash.

On Friday the 12 comes in with light breezes from
both steering. A B in company with the
Whit all night luffed at them with the main
yard aback. Middle part the mile, rather part
made all sail stowed. A B & employed in
winding down the main to mast and sending up
A there one saw blackfish about Sat Day.

Saluad the 13 comes in with 10 fine breeze from
South steering E. S. E. for the harbour of Port Moresby
Pica at 3 P.M. out of the harbour and towed near
3 English Barge's and A Brio taking gold
and silver in, stood on shore W. N. W. the Harbour
lay in the latitude of 20.58 Long 70.10 mid. L.
fast light winds from S. E. with part made all
sail stood in N. E. & came slowly of pinback in
Lat Long 81

Sunday the 14 came on with five barges from
Butch stowing. & the land in sight reddish
brown. the same latter part saw blackish we heard
in company with the three boats the set sun of
them brought them along side and took
them in of Point Barrow in sight of the
hookers at last.
