

June the 23 A.D. 1840

Wednesday the 24 comes in with a fine breeze from S.E. steering West at night went aboard the middle part stored West by N latter part N.W. West 11 ends Lat 15-50 Long 73-10

Thursday the 25 comes in with a fine breeze from Eastward steering N.W. by N middle part stored West by N latter part employed in boiling the blackish and mending the starboard boat 11 ends Lat 15-50 Long 73-10

Friday the 26 comes in with light breeze from the Eastward running down towards the land we at 1 P.M. picked up a boat middle part stored off under main top sail and main top sail said latter part killed N.W. by N at 4 P.M. saw sperm whales several but did not hit one nor they we called by the ship before we hoard it being foggy 11 ends Lat 15 Long 73-10

Saturday the 27 comes in with moderate breeze from S.E. standing at shore at 4 P.M. saw 2 or 3 small whales and shot one it proved to be a catfish and a Vantack not named we saw 2 sperm whales one saw and we round out our starboard boat struck him and killed him but layed on him all night at daylight we brought him along side and commenced cutting 11 ends



Lat 15-50 Long 73-10

June the 27 A.D. 1840

Saturday the 28 comes in with light breeze from S.E. employed in cutting at night finished middle part stored breeze from S.E. lay S.W. latter part 11 ends Lat 16-5 Long 73-10

Monday the 29 comes in with strong breeze from S.E. lay S.W. under double reef top sails at 4 P.M. tacked ship lay S.W. middle part sailed out in S.W. latter part tacked back again for the wind 11 ends Lat 16-00 Long 73-10

Tuesday the 30 comes in with strong breeze from S.E. standing in for the land at 4 P.M. wore ship lay S.W. middle part the same latter light winds stood in shore 11 ends Lat 15-56
