

July the 1. A.D. 1840

Wednesday the 1 comes in with light breeze from the SE finished boiling with middle part backed ship lay in P. & V. latter part saw 2 vessels. Windward seen
 Latitude 15.50 Long 75. S.W. by N. 18 11
 N. 88 80 N. 11 11

Thursday the 2 comes in with strong SE trade at 1 P.M. the Henry Astor of San Francisco ran down and spoke us 4.15 at 3 the Calanta spoke us 4 months out clear middle part lay S.W. latter part steering down the coast so ends
 Latitude 15.25 Long

Friday the 3 comes in with strong breezes from SE steering along by the land at night under double reef fore and main top sail middle part more under ship saw in Fog. & latter part steering S.W. so ends
 Lat

Saturday the 4 comes in with strong SE trades at 2 P.M. spoke the Calanta San Francisco and 2 other vessels under three sails latter part standing in for the land

Sunday the 5 comes in with strong breezes from SE in company with the Henry and Calanta middle part hauled in S.W. latter part steered S.W. under double reef top sail Pisco on our weather bow six miles

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Monday the 6 comes in with light breeze from S.W. steering at the bar for the port of Pisco at 4 P.M. anchored at the town middle part light wind from North latter part engaged in cleaning ship and getting ready for painting so ends

Tuesday the 7 comes in with breezes from S.W. at 4 P.M. got under way and beat out the bay it being a small place no grain vessels have anchored to lay here middle part light air from N.W. steering S.W. N. latter part the Island of Chincha bearing S.W. distant 10 miles at 8 P.M. spoke the schooner Lord Nelson of Pisco bound in to Pisco 4 days from Callao took seven barrels of our two bags of shot one barrel of sperm oil and 4 star 18 lbs so ends

Wednesday the 8 comes in with light breezes from S.W. lay N.W. steering away the anchors and chains middle part light breeze from N.W. lay S.W. by N. latter part the same Lat 15.40 Long

Thursday the 9 comes in light air and calm in company with the Calanta middle part light breezes from S.W. steering S.W. by N. latter part

Friday the 10 comes in with light breezes from S.W. saw boats of limebark middle part saw 4 small boats saw a ship to windward cutting saw black fish several but did not get any so ends
