

Galapagos Islands 1840

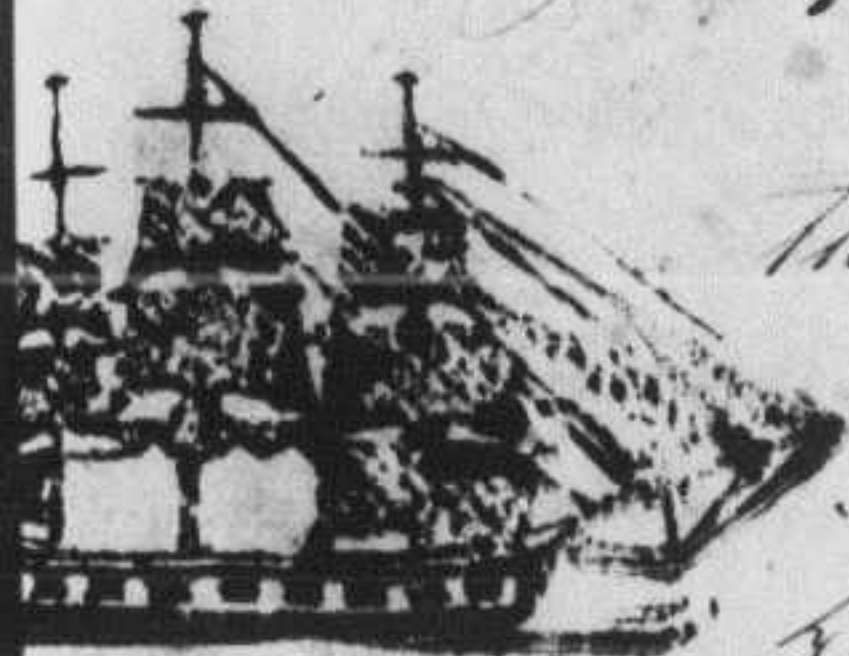
Wednesday September the 9
this 24 hour comes in with strong breezes
from S.E. steering E by N. at 10 employed
in ship's duty at night more than
lay W by S at 8 A.M. passed Rodondo then
middle part the same latter part saw
a ship to seaward steering N.W. at
noon saw Guadalupe I. 100 miles distant
10 miles to land 2 men sick

Thursday September the 10
this 24 hour comes in with strong breezes
from S.E. N.W. employed in ship's duty
middle part lay S.W. under three topsails
latter part the same 2 men sick
latitude 5 miles North long 92 00

Friday September the 11
this 24 hour comes in with light breeze from
S.E. lay E by S. employed in ship's duty at
night saw Menagos Island bearing North
distance 30 miles middle part thick weather
latter part lay S.E. with strong breezes from
S.W. the North head of Albamar bearing
S.E. distant 30 miles 20 men sick

Saturday September the 12
this 24 hour comes in with strong breezes from
South S.W. saw 2 ships to windward at 10 M. backed
lay W by South middle part close in by
latter part at 9 A.M. spoke the Barkley
Smith and went on board of the ship
after being very sick at noon saw another
ship 10 miles

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Sunday September the 13
this 24 hour comes in with strong
breeze standing in for the
North head of Albamar at
10 M. spoke the Barkley
Pinner at night stood off shore middle
part light breeze so latter part saw two ships
at ends latitude 10 miles N long 94 40 men
sick

Monday September the 14
this 24 hour comes in with strong breezes from
the Southward lay W by North head bearing
by S distant 30 miles middle part lay
West by S latter part W by S saw plenty
of fin backs A strong current setting to
the N.W. at ends lat 30 miles N long 94 40
men sick

Tuesday September the 15
this 24 hour comes in with strong breezes from
S.W. lay S.W. under single sail at 10 M. saw
employed in ship's duty middle part the
same latter more moderate sail the main
top gallant sail 20 men sick
latitude 10 miles South long 96 59

Friday September the 16
this 24 hour comes in with moderate breezes
from S.W. and pleasant lay S.W. employed
in ship's duty at 2 P.M. unbent the fore
top sail and bent up side one middle
part hazy weather latter part made
all sail steered S.W. with light breeze
from E. 20 men sick lat 10 10 long 99 15
