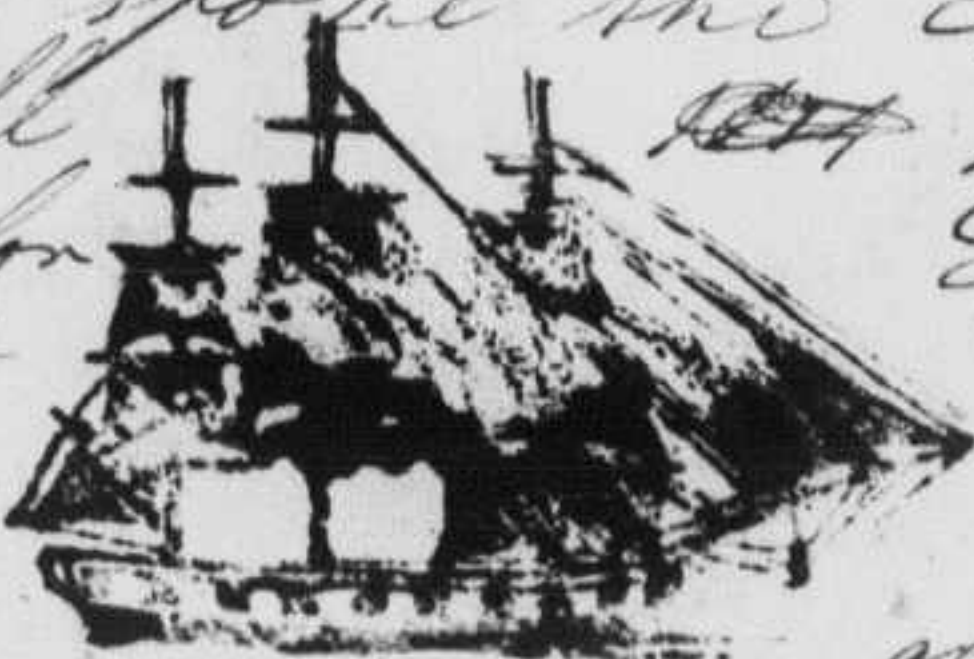


Off shore ground 1849

Thursday October the 4
this 24 hours comes in with strong S. trade
lay S. W. employed in getting in the gun
and case at 8 P.M. finished got supper and
sat the watch and commenced boiling
middle part boiling latter part wore ship
lay S. W. under double reef topsails and
fore sail employed in boiling so ends
Latitude 5.44 Longitude 107.4

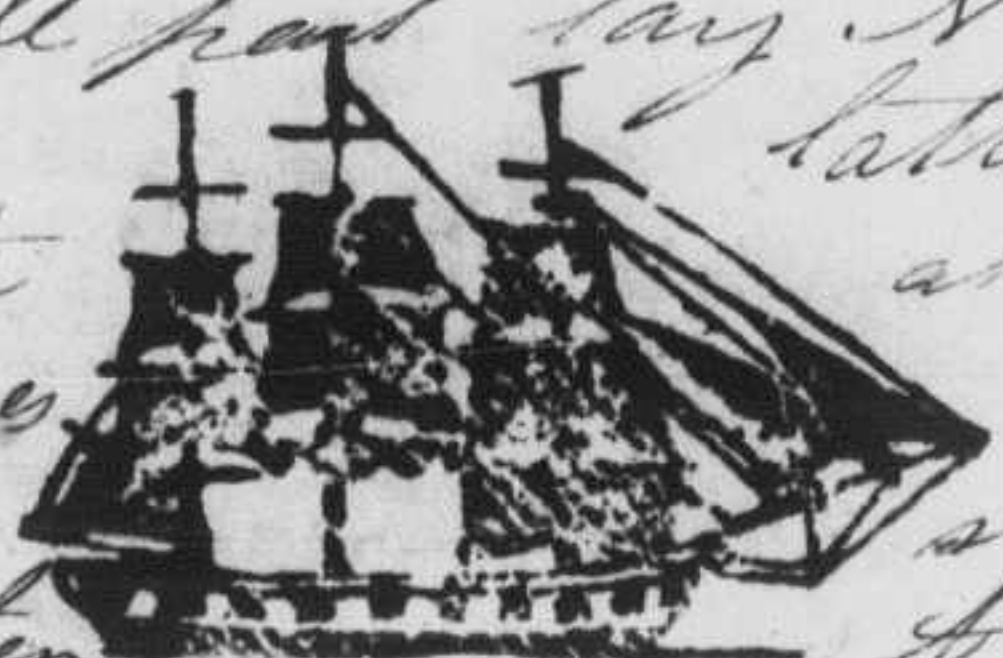
Friday September the 2
this 24 hours comes in with strong S. trade
lay S. W. employed in boiling middle
part the same latter part at daylight
finished boiling so ends at 10 P.M. saw
several ships all hands employed in coopers
our oil and cleaning ship so ends so
Latitude 5.19 Longitude 107

Saturday October the 3
this 24 hours comes in with moderate trades
at one spoke the Metacomb Capt
Greenall ~~1400~~ 1400 33 month in
bound for Talcahuano in
about 5 month middle
part lay S. W. attended with
squalls of wind and rain
latter part the same so ends and
sick Lat 5.2 Longitude 106.45



Off shore ground 1849

Sunday October the 4
this 24 hours comes in with strong S. trade
all hands employed in washing their cloths
middle part lay S. W. under double reef
topsails latter part wore
at 8.5 N. spoke
to James Lopez Cathcart
off Santuckit 14.00.00
did taken to Wale the day before
we lifted to make sail and stood to the
N. W. attended with light squalls of rain
so ends Latitude 3.27 Lon 105.30 med sick



Monday October the 5
this 24 hours comes in with moderate
breezes from the Eastward lay S. W.
middle part wore ship lay S. W. under
three topsails and course latter part
attended with light squalls of rain
at 9 P.M. tacked ship lay S. W. N. so
ends Lat 5.28 Long 105.15 med sick

Tuesday October the 6
this 24 hours comes in with light easterly winds
lay S. W. employed in ship duties
saw 2 ships to seaward and one priva
te middle part lay S. W. latter part
hoisted out for water at 10 P.M. parted
the port broke to the fly via unburnt
it employed in mending it
so ends med sick
Latitude 59 miles South Long 102.15
