

Bound for Tombas in 1840

Thursday December the 10
this 24 hours comes in with strong breezes from
S by E employed in ship's duty middle part
lay S by E latter part thick at 10 A.M. saw the
land bearing S by E so ends and man sick
latitude 1... South Longitude 81... 20

Friday December the 11
this 24 hours comes in with light breezes and
cloudy weather lay up S by E employed in
ship's duty at night tacked S by E lay W by N
the Island of Delaplata bearing N
distant 15 miles middle part lay up S by E
latter part light breezes and thick sleeping up
the coast so ends latitude 2... South Longitude

Saturday December the 12
this 24 hours comes in with light breezes and thick
sleeping up the coast at night Point Saint
bearing S by E middle part light breezes and
pleasant latter part much the same Point
bearing S by E distant 6 miles so ends
and man sick

Sunday December the 13
this 24 hours comes in with light breezes and
pleasant lay S by E at night Point Saint
bearing North distant 3 miles middle
part light breezes bearing S by E latter
part much the same so ends Tombas in
sight

Laying in Tombas

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Monday December the 14
this 24 hours comes in with light breezes from
S by E steering in for Tombas at 2 P.M.
anchored off Tombas Point middle part
calm latter part employed in getting gear
raft ashore for water so ends

Tuesday December the 15
this 24 hours comes in with light breezes
from S by E sent down the main royal
and top gallant yards middle part
calm latter part got of the raft of
water so ends in Tombas

Wednesday December the 16
this 24 hours comes in with light breezes
from S by E sent down the main top gallant
mast and maintopmast middle part light
airs and pleasant latter part employed in fitting
the rigging and at noon got
the topmast in end so ends a man sick

Thursday December the 17
this 24 hours comes in with light S by E wind
at night we laid the topmast and top
gallant mast aloft and rigging set up
middle part light airs and pleasant latter
part sent the sail so ends
a man sick
