

Cruising off Quibo in year 1843

Monday March the 8
This 24 hours comes in with light breeze from Southward steering West middle part much the same latter part employed in cooping out and stowing down in the after hold so Quicars bearing N.W. distant 20 miles

Tuesday March the 9
The 24 hours comes in with breeze from Northward steering employed in stowing down at night finished stowing 430 barrels at dark spoke the Guillemo Takahuanan middle part lay with the main yard abaft latter part braced forward lay N.W. with strong breeze from N.E. so end Quicars bearing N. distant 20 miles

Wednesday March the 10
This 24 hours comes in with light breeze from N.W. at night spoke the Francenergetta middle part light breeze so end a men sick Quicars bearing N.W. distant 15 miles

Thursday March the 11
This 24 hours comes in with light S.W. winds lay S.E. at night spoke the Francenergetta N. England and Guillemo middle part attend with light showers of rain lay South under double reef repairs latter part much the same so end a men sick Quicars bearing North distant 15 miles

Friday March the 12
This 24 hours comes in with light breeze from S.W. lay S.E. in company with the three last mentioned ships middle and latter part much the same attended with light showers of rain so end a men sick Quicars bearing North distant 20 miles

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Saturday March the 13
This 24 hours comes in with light breeze at night spoke the New England middle part lay South with the main yard abaft latter part strong N.E. trades lay S.E. in company with the New England a men sick Quicars bearing North distant 25 miles

Sunday March the 14
This 24 hours comes in with light breeze lay South all sail at midday and latter part steering North so end a men sick Quicars bearing N.E. distant 20 miles

Monday March the 15
This 24 hours comes in with light Westly winds steering S by S middle part the same latter part strong by winds backed ship at 10 A.M. one boat went on shore at Quicars so end a men sick

Tuesday March the 16
This 24 hours comes in with light Westly winds steering N.E. at 4 P.M. the boat came on board after having gone round the land and exploring it, it is inhabited with two Spaniards, the chief produce is coconuts wood and water is found in abundance, middle part heading up for Quibo harbour latter part at 10 A.M. came to anchor in Quibo harbour two boats went on shore for wood and water which is found in abundance so ends all hands well

Wednesday March the 17
This 24 hours comes in with N.E. breeze employed in getting off wood middle part calm latter part getting off wood so ends lying in Quibo
