

Laying in Quibo in year 1841

Thursday March the 18

This 24 hours comes in with light air from the West all hands employed in getting off wood middle part strong N.W. breeze & having obtained what wood we wanted at daylight took over anchor and went to sea so as to point of Quibo bearing S.E. distant 10 miles two were sick

Friday March the 19

This 24 hours comes in with light air and calm steering East S.W. all sail set at night strong N.W. wind steering S.W. at middle part led down the top sail lay N.W. with the mainyard apace latter part made it steer S.W. saw three Ship ends Quicars bearing North distant 20 miles one man sick

Saturday March the 20

This 24 hours comes in with light Northely winds at three P.M. spoke the three last mentioned Ship middle calm latter part light breeze made all sail spoke the Quicars so end Quicars bearing N.W. distant 5 miles we was sick

Sunday March the 21

This 24 hours comes in with light breeze from steering S.E. middle and latter part the same so ends Quicars bearing N.E. distant 20 miles

Monday March the 22

This 24 hours comes in with light N.W. winds at 9 P.M. a shoal of sperm whales heard four boats and gave chase but they being so far off, and two other Ships had anchored that we hardly got a smell at where they had been middle part and latter calm so ends Mountaosa bearing North distant 55 miles Quicars N.W. by E distant 20 miles

Crossing off Quibo in 1841

Tuesday March the 22

This 24 hours comes in with light Northely winds steering East at night spoke the Quicars Talcahuano Simon Monte 50 barrels and New England Doughkeeper East Cornwall 50 barrels middle part steering S.E. latter part in so ends employed in Ship duty so ends Quicars bearing North distant 25 miles

Wednesday the 23 we have light breeze from East steering S.W. three Ships in sight at night Mountaosa bearing East distant 30 mile - middle and latter part light breeze steering N.East - Thursday the 25 attend

with light southerly winds steering N.East, employed in Ship duty, middle part steering N.W. - latter part strong breeze from N.E. course West by North employed in fixing rigging, at noon Quicars bearing North distant 25 miles - the 26 light air and calm

nothing material going on, the 27 - comes in with light steering different courses, at night in company with the New England, middle part lay N.E., latter part much the same - Quicars bearing N.W. distant 30 miles, Sunday being the 28 we have light N.East winds, lay N.W. East, middle part lay S.W. in company with the Frances Henry

than New Bedford latter part the same, Quicars bearing N.W. distant 30 miles, the 29, 30, & 31 attended with light southerly winds, steering East but the current being so strong to the Eastward that we gain but by little, Mountaosa in sight the whole time

Thursday April the 1 1841

comes in with light southerly winds steering East in company with the New England, employed in
