 Hand bearing S. E. distant 15 miles; Thursday
 Friday the 16, this 24 hours the same as the
 last, at noon the Island bearing W. N. W. distant
 20 miles, — Saturday April the 17 comes
 in with light E. by N. winds, steering S. E.
 in company with the N. England — middle
 part the same, latter part, at 9 A. M. saw
 a shoal of Sperm Whales, the N. England took
 three boats, and we the same, each one trying
 to get their first — at last one of our boats struck
 a large Whale, and got him, so ends ~~the~~
 Sunday the 18 comes in with light breeze, still
 in chase of Whales, at 1 P. M. board the fourth boat
 and each boat got a Whale — 
 at night, had one whale in — so ends
 sat the watch, and commenced boiling, middle part
 attended with light showers of rain, at daylight
 commenced cutting at noon had two more in — so ends
 Latitude 4.50 Longitude 89.00
 Monday the 19, comes in with light breeze, and squalls
 day S. E. in company with the N. England — we let
 there have one Whale, to boil on shore, the weather being so
 warm, that we were afraid it would, West on ship
 middle and latter part, employed in boiling, so ends
 Latitude 4.40 Longitude 89.50 — Tuesday the 20
 comes in with light S. E. winds, day S. W. employed
 in boiling, middle part the same, latter part, at 11
 finished boiling 105 barrels, so ends Latitude 4.
 Longitude 90.00 — Wednesday the 21 comes
 in with moderate breeze and pleasant steering S. E.
 middle and latter part the same, so ends
 Latitude 4.00 Longitude 91

Bound Westward in 1841 ⁸⁵ April
 Thursday the 22 - 23 - 24 and 25, steering about
 S. West by S; in company with the N. England
 one the 20 loose right of consort, all hands employed
 in stowing down oil, at noon finished stowing
 down 96 barrels, this day, by the observation
 taken, we find ourselves in the Latitude of 59 miles
 South, Longitude 97.10 West — Tuesday the 27
 fine breeze, course S. W. the 28. light breeze, and
 some rain, employed in setting up shooks, the 30
 strong S. E. trades, steering W. S. W. under all sail, so ends
 Latitude, by observation 3.25 South, Longitude 106. West

Saturday May the 1, 1841
 the first, second, and third, strong S. E. trades, steering
 line S. West, to West, — Tuesday the 4 strong S. E.
 trades steering N. W. by W. middle part the same, latter
 part, saw a shoal of Sperm Whales, at 11 — board
 three boats, at noon, struck one, he sounded out the
 line, and cleared out with it, at any rate we never
 got the glimpse of the line, nor whale, neither afterwards
 we came aboard took up our boats, and kept off our course
 so ends Latitude 4.20 South Longitude 115.45
 Wednesday the 5. we have strong breezes, steering
 line S. West, steering rigging Lat. 2.25 Longitude 117.45
 Friday the 7 comes in with strong S. E. trades, steering
 line S. West by N. — fitting rigging — middle and latter part
 the same — so ends; Latitude 2.15 Longitude 120.45
 Saturday the 8 cor. fine trades course N. West
 Sunday the 9 we have fine breeze from N. E. course
 N. West — this day we find our selves in the latitude
 of 20 miles North and Longitude 125.00
 Monday — Tuesday, and Wednesday — have light
 Partly squalls, course from N. W. to W. N. W.
 Thursday the 13 fine breeze, Lat. 18. N Longitude 133.25
