

Sandwich Island, 1841

to be very much interested, in our wellfare  
at night, calm, the sky serene and clear,  
and all things look beautiful, and as the  
sawing shades <sup>arise</sup> over us, the moon with all her  
splendor, ascending over the hills, sends forth a  
ray of light - just at that moment the land  
breeze blows over the hills, bringing a most  
pleasant smell, and as the sails swell to the  
breeze, we glide along our onward course, viewing  
the landscapes as we glide along the land,  
through the night, we, near the shore down  
at daylight find ourselves of the town of  
Pahukoa, and send the boat in for a few  
things to take up to Mouee, so ends.

Thursday the 30 comes in with light N. West  
winds; beating up the shore - middle part  
strong trades, at 2 P.M. split the foretop sail, from  
beak to beak, and at the same time the lower  
main top sail sheets went, so we lost one of them  
entirely, so we were obliged to send down both  
top sails, and sent two more, at daylight we  
saw down, Haawalaue, it is a small island  
situated about ten miles N. West from Mouee,  
and is the place, where all the transports, are  
sent to; at 11 P.M. the boat went one shore  
at Pahukoa - the ship beating up for the bow  
so ends, then sets from Mouee.

Friday the 31 comes in with light breeze from the  
ward, beating up for the town at 4 P.M. came  
to anchor off Pahukoa sound in 16 fathoms  
water, middle part fine latter part employed  
in getting a raft of cork ashore for water, so  
ends.

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Saturday the 1 comes in with light Westly  
winds nothing material going on, middle  
part fine, latter part employed in cleaning ship  
ends, Mahini. Sunday the 2 day of  
Vincany, comes in with light S. West winds -  
middle part of Pater, middle part cloudy, latter  
part employed in getting off water, so ends.

Monday the 3 comes in with strong Westly  
winds, middle part calm, latter part light  
breezes from S. employed in getting off potatoes  
so ends. - Tuesday the 4 comes in with  
light S. West, getting off potatoes - middle part  
calm, latter part much the same, so ends.

Wednesday the 5 comes in with light air, all round  
at 4 P.M. took on board, having on  
board, about 20 passengers for Pookoo, the  
Captain being sick did not go with us -  
middle part strong trades, running down  
for Pookoo - latter part doubled reefed  
the top sails, at daylight, passed Diamond Head  
at 4 P.M. the boat went on shore, at Pookoo  
the ship laying off and on, so ends, Captain  
sick in Mouee. Thursday the 6 comes in with  
light breeze, laying off an on, at night the  
heat came on board, middle part stood to  
the E. S. E. for Mouee again, latter part calm  
so ends, Pookoo in sight.

Friday the 7 comes in with light Eastly winds,  
standing to the S. E. middle part strong trades, double  
reefed the top sails, at daylight, gave the board  
leaving N. E. distant 15 miles, latter part  
standing up for Mouee so ends.  
within 4 miles of Mouee
