

Sandwich Islands, 1842

Saturday February the 12. comes in with light breezes from N.W. employed in cutting the Phale, at 4 P.M. finished cutting, middle part lay with the main yard aback, latter part strong Westly winds; employed in boiling two canoes along side, so ends. 6 miles from the land. Sunday February the 13, comes in with light Westly winds, running down for Hirakur, at 5 P.M. the boat went, and shore at 7 P.M. finished boiling, the Phale, middle part steering S.W., latter part at 10 P.M. saw a school of sperm Phales, board all four boats, and captured three, the larboard boat got stove, so ends. 6 miles from land. five men sick.

Monday February the 14 comes in with light S.W. winds, at 3 P.M. got the Phales along side and commenced cutting, at night finished cutting two, middle part lay by the Phale, latter part cut the Phale in, and commenced boiling, so ends, a man sick.

Tuesday February the 15 comes in with light S.W. winds, boiling, middle part much the same, latter part, saw a ship, at night finished boiling, so ends three men sick, two men sick with oil.

Wednesday the 16 comes in with light Westly winds, employed in mending the boat, at 4 P.M. spoke the Barque, D. Anson, for the 16 months out 200 barrels sperm oil, middle part lay with the mainyard aback, latter part, light, light breezes, the Barque ran in off Harakoo, and came to, so ends, three men sick.

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Thursday February the 17. comes in with light Westly winds, laying off Harakoo, middle part calm, latter strong Northly winds; steering S.W. employed in storing down oil, so ends, one man sick.

Friday the 18, comes in with light S.W. winds, latter run the same, so ends.

Saturday the 19, comes in with light air and pleasant weather, middle and latter part much the same, so ends, five miles from land, so ends, one man sick.

Sunday the 20 comes in with light Westly winds, lay S.W., at 5 P.M. the boat went to shore. At Harakoo at night, came on board, middle part, ran for Hirakur, and then back for South point, latter part strong breezes, so ends, one man sick.

Monday the 21 comes in with strong Westly winds in Harakoo, middle part fine, latter part calm, employed in ship duty, so ends, one man sick.

Tuesday the 22 comes in with a fine Westly winds, laying off Harakoo, at night the boat went to shore, middle part, light air, from Eastward, latter the boat came, on board fired several guns, Parkinson berth day, so ends.

Wednesday the 23 comes in with light Westly winds, lay S.W., employed in ship duty, middle part, lay S.W., latter part calm, so ends, one man sick.

Thursday the 24 comes in with light Westly winds, nothing material going on, middle part, calm, the boat went on shore at Harakoo, and returned again bringing the Captain, of the Favorite, so ends, one man sick, Harakoo bay.
