Thursday March the 10, comes in with light breezes, employed in Ships duty, middle part calm, latter part, employed in Ships duty, at 11. & 16 the Captain went on shore at, Chebow so ends. — Wednesday the 11. comes in with

Wednesday the 11. comes in, m. light, Partly winds, Capt. Returned, sniddle for fine latter part much the same - ~~seeds~~. employed in getting off, logs for house frame.

24. Sinks, , Saturday the 12. comes in with light
breezy and pleasant, weather — beating us for another
middle part much the same, rather fast, abreast of

Onehow, sends— Sunday March the 13. come
in with light Notherly winds; employed in getting off
logs from Onehow, middle part, beating to the

earlier part, saw a Schooner. She, proved to be
the Franceskenery, after, a Bedford, so ends.

Monday the 14 comes in with strong N. West
wind at 4 P.M. the boat went ~~to~~ shore
and back, Captain - at 10 - returned again

middle part, Bay of Plover; latter part
employed in taking off passengers for
Spencer, at # 2 Mo, latter taking on

board, 75 males and 56 females, natives,
and one missionary doctor, his wife two chil-
dren, we made sail, for Moonie; 29 sept.

Northely winds, beating up the coast in company with the above mentioned S.W. wind.

"Wednesday the 18th, comes in with strong
N.E. breeze showing bar - 30.00 - 30.00 - 30.00"

the top gallant sails, and single reefed the
top sails, our passengers, all, being seasick

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we have a shocking nasty mess, of it
and through the night, they are roving from one
side of the deck to the other, some singing and
others talking over past troubles, or those which are
to come, till we are most stupefied, at daylight

coyne, till we are most stunted, at daylight
Labina town in sight, at 4 PM dropped our
anchor in 15 fathoms water coral bottom, nine
ships laying in here --- our passengers

going on shore & so ends — Thursday the 14th
 comes in with light westerly winds, at night
 all our passengers ~~to~~ on shore, middle part

Friday, the 18 comes in with light westerly winds
employed in getting our lumber on shore, at night

finished - middle part fine, latter part
employed in getting cargo ashore for water

length, Taburda the 19, comes in with
light breezes, paying bends, middle part five
blatter for got off it, hundred barrels of water

and showed it away, so ends, --- Sunday
the 20 comes in with light air and rainey
middle part fine latter part rancy, so ends ---

Monday the 21 comes in with light winds
and nancy; middle part fine latter part nancy
Tuesday the 22, comes in with light winds and

raney, middle and latter part much the same, so ends. -- -- Wednesday the 23 come in with light air and rany middle part fine.

rather part attended with light showers of rain
ends, Thursday the 24 comes in with light
winds, and fair weather middle and latter
part of the same is much the same.

Friday the 25 comes in with light Drizzle some
muddle, and latter part .. much the same ..
