

Sandwich Islands 1842

Saturday March the 26 comes in with light breezes, and pleasant weather, at two P.M. this Majesty, the King of the Sandwich Islands, gathered with the rest of suite; visited the ship, and, dined with us at 5, when leaving the shore we fired to salute of two guns — and when leaving the ship, we saluted them, with seven — middle part five latter part much the same, so ends —

Sunday the 27 comes in with a fine breeze from Westward, middle part calm latter part, at 10 P.M. took our anchor at 12 the Captain came on board, in the King's six cord gig, so ends — Monday the 28 comes in with light breezes, station out for the channel, at 12 P.M. took the N.E. trade, steering for, Workos, middle part at 10 P.M. came to off Portos bar in 12 fathoms water, at 11 the Captain went on shore latter part much the same — so ends —

Tuesday the 29 comes in with strong N.E. trades the boat on shore, middle and latter part much the same, so ends — Wednesday the 30 comes in with strong trades, middle part fine, latter part, one boat on shore, so ends — Thursday the 31 comes in with strong trades, boat & boats crew, middle and latter part much the same, so ends —

Friday April the 1 comes in with strong trades, middle and latter part much the same, so ends — Saturday the 2 comes in with light Southly and rainy middle part much the same, latter part strong breezes, at 10 P.M. we shipped our chain, 70 fathoms, and ran in to the harbour, and anchored, so ends, —

Sunday the 3 comes in with light Southly winds all hands on shore, so ends — Monday the 4 comes in with light Southly winds all hands on shore, so ends — Tuesday April the 5 comes in with light breezes, latter part took our anchor, and went out over the bar, and got chain and anchor, so ends — Wednesday the 6 comes in with light trades, middle part much the same, latter part took our anchor and lay off and on — so ends — the Captain on shore — Thursday April the 7 comes in with strong trades, laying off and on, the Captain & one boat crew on shore, middle part lay off shore, at 2 P.M. tacked in, at daylight tacked the coarser, at 8 P.M. shot the foremast, and furlled it then furlled the main sail, so ends —

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Friday April the 8 comes in with strong trades, laying off and on, at night the boat came on board with the Captain, put away for Atoai, middle part strong trades, steering N.E., latter part made the Island of Atoai sent the boat on shore, at Colone, but the trades being so strong we could not anchor, so we ran down to, Pebymore, middle part lay off and on the pilot on board, latter part ran in and anchored in 14 fathoms water, sandy bottom the Ladies, as we were in a great hurry to get on shore, but the being but 18 of them, they hardly knew whether to go on shore here, at 10 P.M. to Colone with her, so ends —
