

Pandwich Islands, 1842

Sunday April the 17, comes in with light
trade, employed in getting off potatoes, at night
for Custard, and myself, were invited out to, Mr
Holdens, to have tea, middle part returned
latter part all hands on shore, so ends —
Monday April the 18, comes in with light
N.E. trade — at night all hands on shore, middle
part fine, latter part strong trade, at 11 P.M.
the boat went on shore, and returned with the
Captain, Mr. Holden, his wife and boy, and Miss Holden
and I visit, but their being so much smell on, that
they enjoy themselves but poorly, for they were scorch
by the time they had got clew up on board, however they
stayed till, dinner time, but eat nothing, (at 3 P.M. we
sat them on shore.) Tuesday April the 19, comes in
with strong trade, — middle part, much the same
latter part, a schooner came down and anchored
so ends, Wednesday April the 20, comes in with
strong trade, nothing to do, our ladies in good health
but rather down in the mouth to think they have
got to leave us so soon, middle part fine
latter part, took in the larboard boat, employed
in mending her — so ends; Thursday the 21
comes in with strong trade, nothing to do;
middle part fine, sleep well, all the gals in
good spirits, latter part much the same; so ends
Friday April the 22, comes in with light trade,
nothing going on, middle part, fine, latter
part, at 6 A.M. sat our ladies on shore, and took
a riding trip, at 7 A.M. took our anchor and
stood off and on, at noon the Captain came
on board so ends, Saturday the 23 comes in with
light trade, steering for Enghow, middle part
fine, latter, running down, long the island, for the town
so ends

Bound Northward 1842

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Sunday April the 24 comes in with light trade
at 1 P.M. the boat went on shore at Enghow
for yams, at night got off fifty barrels, and several
barrels of potatoes, the town consists of three
dwelling houses, and a school house; the principal
produce, are yams, potatoes, and onions, middle
part lay N.N.W. under double reef topsails, latter part
much the same so ends, Monday April the 25
comes in with strong N.N.E. trade, middle
part lay N.N.W. under double reef topsails, latter
part much the same, so ends, Latitude 24.31
Longitude 162.36 — Tuesday April the 26
comes in with strong trade, lay N.N.W. middle
part, lay under double reef mainsail, and foresail
latter part, set double reef topsails, so ends, our new
sick, Latitude 24.54, Longitude 163.56
Wednesday April the 27, comes in with strong
N.E. trade, steering N.W. employed in ship's duty,
middle part steering N.N.W. latter part, made all
sail, so ends, Latitude 25.59, Longitude 166.10
Thursday April the 28, comes in with strong southerly
winds took in topgallant sails, employed in ship's
duty, at night doubled reefed the top sails middle
steering West, latter part course S.W. so ends
Latitude, 27.57. Longitude, 168.20
Friday, the 29, comes in with strong gales, from
N.E. steering S.W. at night close reefed the
topsails, steering S.W. middle part the same
latter, steering West, so ends, Latitude 28.25
Longitude 172.40 — Saturday April the 30
comes in with strong gales from N.E. steering
West, under close reef topsails, middle part
much the same, latter part, all hands employed
in washing their clothes, so ends — Latitude 28.54
Longitude 174.24
