Sunday, July 10

comes in with strong southerly winds, wore ship lay off at 6 AM finished mending the boat at 10 finished boiling the Phale, 50 lbs middle part five latter part, made sail lay off at 10 ends, Latitude 31-50 Longitude, 178-20

Monday, July the 11

begins with strong S.E. winds, lay off at 10 night wore ship, middle part five latter part, made sail, lay South, saw several finbacks, 10 ends, Latitude 31-9, Longitude 179-11

Tuesday, July the 12

commences with light Easterly winds, lay off employed in ship duty, middle part, wore ship, lay N.E., latter part made all sail, employed in ship duty, 10 ends, Latitude 31-14 Longitude 179-45

Wednesday, July the 13

continues with fine, rather, wind S.E., lay N.E., employed in cooping our oil, middle part lay N.E., under double reef topsails, latter part made all sail, lay N.E., employed in stowing down oil, at noon finished stowing down, 50 lbs 10 ends, Latitude, 31-25, Longitude 178-57

Thursday, July the 14

as fine, as can be all hands, employed in ship's duty, or scrimshawing middle part, wore ship lay S.W. West, latter part made all sail, lay South, 10 ends, Latitude 31-18, Longitude 178-20

Friday, July the 15

begins with a fine Easterly wind, lay South at night shortened sail, middle part wore ship lay N.E., latter part made all sail, and steered, N West, all employed in scrimshawing 10 ends — Latitude 31-24 Long 179-54, for Saturday July the 16

commences with light

S.E. winds lay on steering N.W., at night buffed by the wind N.E., middle part the same, latter part, made all sail, and steered S West, nothing material going on, 10 ends, Latitude 31-24 Longitude 179-11

Sunday, July the 17

comes in with light S.E. breezes, steering S West middle part lay N.E., under double reef topsails, latter part made all sail, & steered S West, saw several finbacks, 10 ends, Latitude 31-29 Longitude 18-20

Monday, July the 18

this day, commences with fine Easterly winds, steering S West, middle part — lay South, under short sail, latter part made all sail, lay S by East, 10 ends, Latitude 30-42, Long 179-11 East

Tuesday, July the 19

continues with light air and pleasant weather, lay S by E, at night shortened sail, wore ship lay N.W. E., middle part, lay N.E., latter part made all sail at 7 AM, saw several Phales going quick to the S West, and steered, after them 10 ends, Latitude 30-24
