Thursday July the 28

with light Southerly winds lay ^{comes in} by N. employed in stowing down at night shortened sail more ship lay S West middle part fine latter part made all sail, lay S West employed in cooping oil, so ends, 2 men sick Latitude 31. Long 178.

Friday July the 29 begins with light Southerly winds lay S West employed in cooping and stowing, at 5 saw sperm whale, but so far to windward of us, that we did not lower at dark shortened sail, the whales in night, middle part lay S West, the whales going S by West, - latter part wore ship lay S, but see nothing of the whales so ends. Latitude 31. 06 Longitude 178. 50

Saturday July the 30 commences with strong Southerly winds, lay N by E, at night double reefed, middle part strong breeze latter part took in the foretop sail, and jib strong gales, lay N by E, so ends 31. 06 Longitude 177. 45

Sunday July the 31. 6 strong gales from S lay S West under short sail at night wore ship, lay S by E, middle part, light breeze latter part made all sail lay East, so ends one man sick, Latitude 31. 04 Long. 176. 51

Monday August the 1

begins with light breezes from Southward lay E, middle part the same latter part lay E by E, under all sail = 50 ends. one man sick Lat 31. 34 Longitude 178. 10

Tuesday August the 2 comes in with light SE winds, wore ship lay S West by S, middle part lay South under three topsails, latter part made all sail lay S by E, employed in stowing down oil, so ends, one man sick Latitude 30. 12 Longitude 178. 00

Wednesday August 3 commences with light Easterly winds, lay S by East at night shortened sail, middle part lay E by E, latter part made all sail wore ship lay N N West, employed in ship's duty, so ends, Lat 29. 45 Long 179. 10

Thursday August 4 this day begins with light breezes, lay N W employed in ship's duty, at night took in sail Middle part wore ship lay N N West, latter part stood to the E by E, so ends Latitude 30. 39 Long 179. 50

Friday August the 5 continues with light N E winds, lay E by E at night wore ship, middle part fine latter part made all sail lay N W, employed in ship's duty, so ends one man sick Latitude 30. 26 Lon 177. 33
