

Bound for Sandwich Islands

October the 23

Sunday begins with strong trade, lay S.E. by S. Middle part strong breezes steering South, at 10 AM, saw the land the South, head of Morotoi bearing South by West, latter part running down the largest for Morotoi so ends. Morotoi in sight, ^{Wood moved such}

Monday, October the 24, comes in with strong trade, steering S.E. by S. for diamond head, at 1 PM, passed it, at 4 PM, came to anchor, in 30 fathoms water, coral bottom, middle part fine, latter part all hands employed in cleaning ship — so ends, worked bar, three men sick.

Tuesday, October the 25

begins with strong, S.E. winds, clearing ship; the Woodman, William Eliza, of New Bedford, the Indian, & Elanor of London, and one brig, middle part fine, latter part, took the Woodman in so ends, worked bar.

Wednesday October the 26 comes in with light trade, employed in ship's duty, at 4 PM, the Elizabeth of London came down and anchored, middle part fine, latter, employed in ship's duty, four ships went in side, so ends.

Thursday October the 27 begins with light trade, middle part much the same, latter part the weather being fair we took our anchor, run in to the harbor and moored ship, unbent all our sails, so ends Honolulu.

Sandwich Islands

Friday October the 28

commences with light breezes; nothing material going on — middle part fine, latter part, all hands employed coopers oil, so ends.

Saturday October the 29 attended with light southerly winds, all hands employed in coopers oil, so ends.

Sunday October the 30 attended with light breezes and calm, at 5 PM, finished coopers oil, middle and latter part, all hands on shore, so ends.

Monday October the 31 attended with light airs, all hands employed in ship's duty, so ends.

Tuesday November the 1 begins with light southerly winds, all hands employed in ship's duty, so ends.

Wednesday November the 2 comes in with light breezes and pleasant weather, employed in getting off water, and building the coobose up a new — middle part, fine, latter part, sent down the fore topmast rigging, so ends.

Thursday November the 3 attended with light breezes and pleasant weather, latter part the Starboard mast went ashore, so ends.
