Friday November the 4

attended with light breezes, and pleasant weather — and watch ashore the rest employed in Ships duty, so ends.

Saturday November the 5

this day as the above

Sunday November the 6

first part employed in Ships duty, latter part all hands go on shore to attend divine worship, but I fear that the larger part of them attended the grog shops the strictest, so ends

Monday November the 7

first part fine, latter part employed in Ships duty, so ends

Tuesday November the 8

attended with strong breezes employed in Ships duty; so ends

Wednesday November, 9

employed in Ships duty, delivered on board the Pilliam 100 barrels of shocks, so ends.

Thursday November the 10

fine breezes and fair weather, delivered on board the Hoodman, 100 barrels of shocks, latter part painting Ship, so ends.

Friday November the 11

thick hazy weather so ends.

Saturday November the 12 attended with fine weather painting Ship, so ends

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Sunday November the 13

attended with fine weather, latter part all hands on shore, so ends.

Monday November the 14

fine pleasant weather, latter part painting Ship, so ends.

Tuesday November the 15

light breezes and pleasant, weather painting Ship so ends

Wednesday November the 16

attended with light breezes and pleasant

Thursday November the 17

fine weather and pleasant so ends

Friday November the 18

fine breezes and pleasant weather, employed in bending the maintopsail, and maintopgallant sail so ends

Saturday November the 19

light breezes and pleasant, all hands on board employed in bending sails, so ends

Sunday November the 20

attended with light breezes, all hands on shore so ends

Monday November the 21

fine breezes and pleasant weather, latter part all hands on board, at 7 o'clock took our starboard anchor on the bow, so ends.

Tuesday November the 22

fine breezes, and pleasant weather, unmoored our Ship and halled in, ready for sea. in the afternoon, latter part, taking in lumber, the wind still so ends — and many sick.
