

Sandwich Islands, 1842
Wednesday December the 14

beginning with strong
northerly winds, at 2 PM, I took our
place along side, 

and commenced cutting, at night got two
of them in, cut in, middle part lay
by the other three, at daylight commenced
cutting again, and noon finished, so ends
8 miles from land

Thursday December the 15
attended with light Northerly winds, got our
duple clear made sail and stood for
Hirohwa, at boiling, at 5 PM, the Capt
came on board, middle part, boiling, latter
part the same -- so ends --

Wednesday December the 16
attended with
light Northerly winds, employed in boiling
middle part the same -- latter part finished
boiling 100 barrels, so ends

Saturday December the 17
attended with light breezes, middle part
and latter fine, employed in to Ship's duty
Sunday December the 18

comes in with light
breezes, setting up shooks, (middle, part)
at 4 PM, went on shore and brought Susan
off, again, middle part light air calm
latter part fine, so ends --

Monday December the 19

comes in with light
air and calm, steering Southward --
middle part fine, latter part employed
in cooping oil; so ends --

Tuesday December the 20
attended with light Northerly winds,
employed in cooping oil, middle part
fine, latter part part employed in stowing
down, the affir hole, so ends --
Wednesday December the 21

comes in with light
breezes, at night finished stowing down
40 barrels, middle part lay with the main
yard aback, latter part, several canoes
came from shore, laden with fruit;
so ends, one man sick

Thursday December the 22
attended with light breezes, middle and
latter part fine weather, employed in Ship's
duty

Friday December the 23
comes in
with fine Northerly winds, employed in
mending sail, middle part fine, latter
part. mending sail, so ends --
Saturday December the 24

comes in with
light air and calm, middle part
steering down for Hilua, latter part
the boat went on shore --
and returned, and went back
again, so ends, 4 miles from land
one man sick --
